"I have my hands full run-ning after my 8 kids and if I have another, I'd die," a 38-year old mother recited to the FP advisor.

Esperanza is only 28 years old with 3 chitdren. For the second time she almost lost her life in the so-called eclampsia of pregancy. Characterized by high blood pressure, swelling and convulsion. Now she is in cons-tant fear of a possible pregancy.

Tibia is a frail woman of 30 with 2 children. She is anemic, weak with frequent cold symptoms due to "weak lungs," Knowing that another pregancy will further drain her health and their finances, she tried to avoid the ad-vances of her weak but sexually hungry husband.

Capceria is a healthy mother of 4 children. Her mother died of cancer of the cervix, Her elder sister died of similar patho-logy, Frequent deliveries will pre-dispose her to cancer of the cervix-heriditary predisposition. Thus, she lives in constant fear of another pregnancy.

Estudia a bright girl of 22, a 2nd year student of Education and married to an engineering

student. Aware of the situation both could not enjoy fully and freely the sexual play as should be expected for fear of pregnancy.

nancy, Especia, only 22 but is already a mother of 4 because of early marriage and a yearly pregnancy. Inspite of her youth her health is already declining. Will she be

allowed a yearly pregnancy? Eslumpia, a habitat of the slum where she share a small dingy room with her tubercu-lous husband and 7 children. lous husband and 7 children. She does not want another pregnancy but she is the only source of entertainment of her romantic husband.

Hochia is a pretty bachelorrete of a prominent family. She was a recent rape victim of a play-boy jeepney driver. Will she be allowed to become pregnant?

The above women have a common problem, fear of preg-nancy. What is the solution? With the advent of FP they need no longer fear of pregnancy. Contraception is the answer to their common problem. Contra-ception to them means freedom from fear. Contraception is avoid-once of pregnancy by the use ance of pregnancy by the use of contraceptives. Contraceptives are methods or procedures to prevent conception or pregnancy.

It is also imperative that the election of delegates to the Cons-titutional Convention be made as inexpensive as possible in order that poor but capable men may have a chance to be elected. And all candidates should be given as much as possible equal media time and space.

Now, all these safeguards are contained more or less in the bills filed by Senator Pelaez in the Senate and Congressmen Imthe Senate and Congressmen Im-perial and Montano in the Lower House. So what should we do? We should urge the speedy pas-sage and approval of this law in order to ensure that the Consti-tutional Convention will be truly representative of all sectors of our community. All segments of our people should be represent-ed. ed.

Moreover, in order that the amended or new Constitution may truly express the sovereign will, the goals and aspirations of all our people, it is necessary for us to conduct a nation-wide in-formational and educational campaign regarding the proposed Constitutional reforms. As Chief Constitutional reforms. As Chief Justice Roberto Concepcion re-cently said in a Constitutional Day speech and I quote him; "It is . . . vitally important for the electorate to know, before the electorate delegates, what, in particulus one the constitution men particular, are the specific mea

the sures such candidate proposes to champion in the Convention ... The people should not be con-tented with generalities ... Nor is it enough that a candidate be honest, patriotic, and learned ... Each candidate should therefore, raise issues based upon concrete reforms he intends to espouse ..."

All of us, therefore, have the duty to study proposed Constitu-tional reforms discuss them with our neighbors, with co-workers in our office, in the farms, in the factories, with all our people in the barrios and rural areas, so that come November 10, 1970, our people will be able to vote intelligently in their choice of their delegates to the Constitu-tional Convention.

Now, the next point is: Just what are some of these basic defects in our present Constitution, and what are the proposed re-forms? Time will not permit us to discuss these in detail but here are a few highlights.

First, we all complain of the excessive concentration of powers in the Chief Executive in our present Constitution. This was originality so because we wanted a strong President, but now we see that this is not good for our country. So what are the pro-po.ed reforms?

First, we shall study measures for the adoption of a parliamen-tary form of government or a semi-parliamentary form similar to that in our former Malolos Constitution,

Second, a return to the uni-cameral legislator; there is no need for a bicameral legislature. Third, deconcentration of pres-idential powers and give more power to local governments. Fourth, if we decide to retain the presidential system, then there is a growing consensus that there should be a fixed term of aix years without re-election. Second, a return to the uni-

Second: Expensive elections. We all know this; we are all complaining about this - that our elections have grown prog-ressively more and more expen-sive and, consequently, less and less democratic. It sis estimated now, and these are conservative figures, that a presidential can-didate need at least P100 million, a senatorial candidate at least P1 million, and a Congressional candidate needs at least P500,candidate needs at least 1300,-000. As a matter of fact, Mr. Max Soliven quoted one sena-torial candidate as having said after the last elections that, ex-clusive of government funds and used funds. expenditures, no less P200 million were spent. less than P200 million were spent. Can we, a developing country, afford such expensive elections? Let us give a thought to that. It has even been published in our
