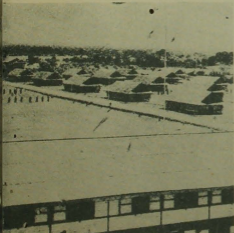


*These typical shacks of 1938 were used for quarters by the 42nd Regiment, 41st Division, located at Tagaytay.*

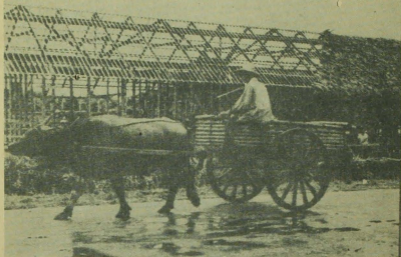


Photo above shows nipa barracks under construction at Camp Sto. Tomas, Batangas, when the war broke out.

*Above: the old enlisted men's village in Camp Murphy Below the old camp chapel. In the places of both buildings today are modern structures.*



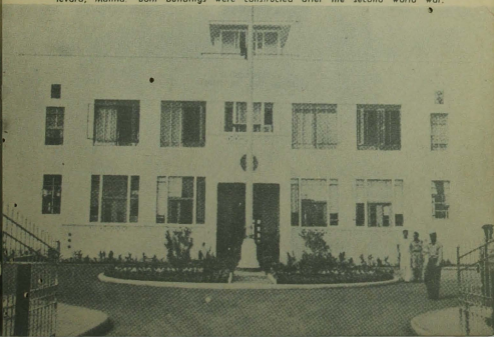


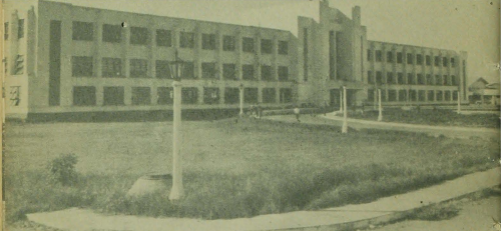

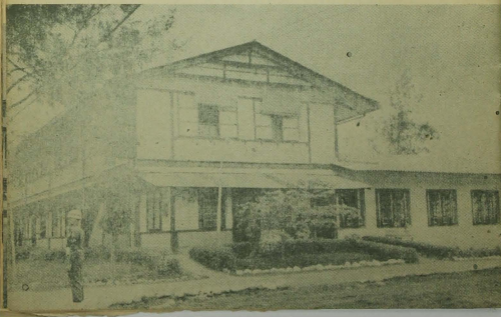

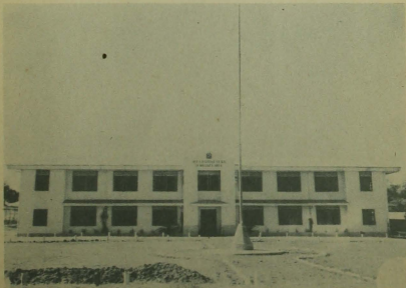

Above is the II MA headquarters at Camp Vicente Lim, Laguna. Below is the IV MA headquarters in Cagayan de Oro City.



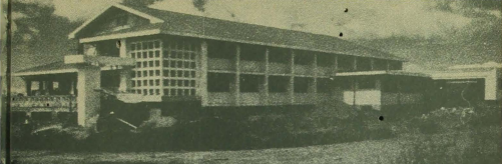


*The present Philippine Military Academy building was constructed in 1949. The old one was destroyed during the war. Below, is the new V. Luna General Hospital in Quezon City.*

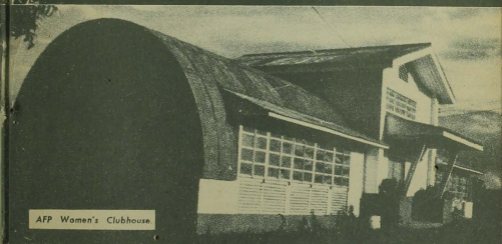
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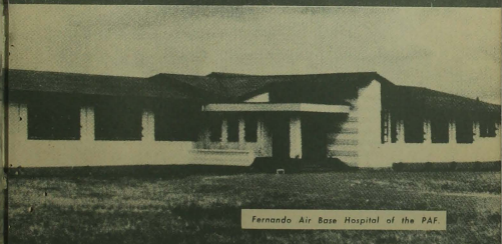




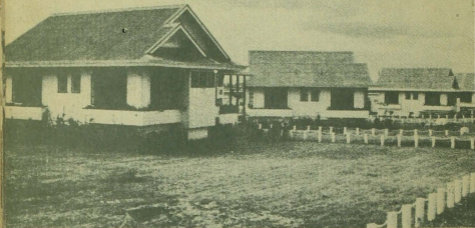
Central Officers' Clubhouse in Camp Murphy.
