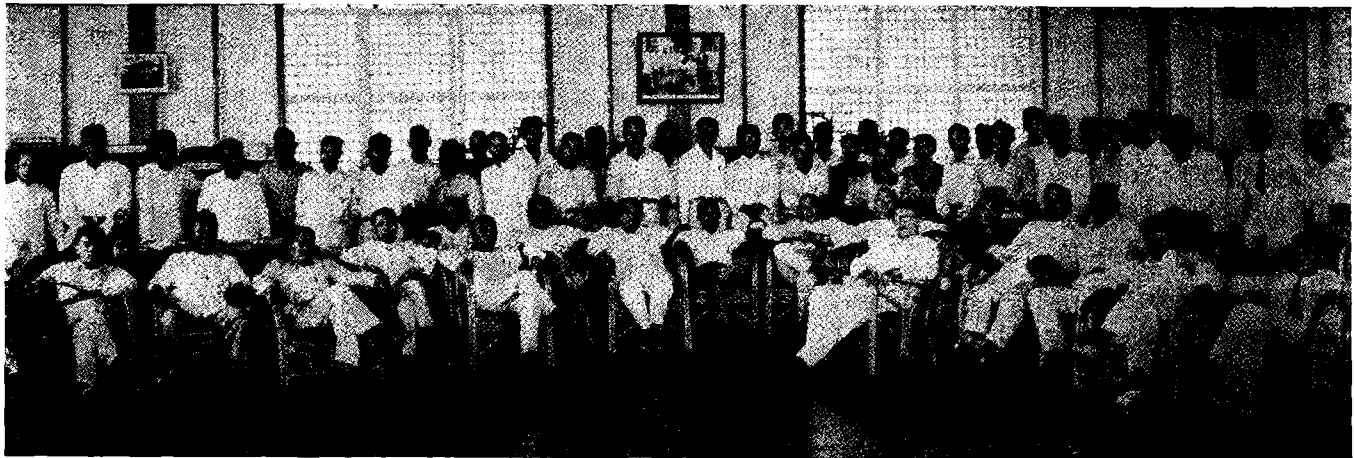


JUNTA GENERAL DE ACCIONISTAS Y ELECCIONES DE LA "MAAO SUGAR PLANTERS ASSOCIATION"

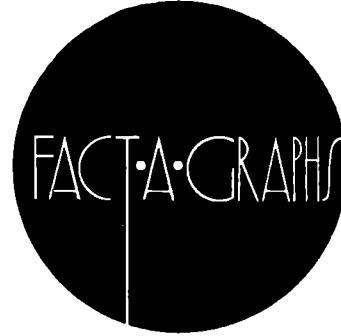
