

NEWS OF THE WEEK

London, July 24. Although Premier Theunis of Belgium and the American representatives to the interallied conference are continuing to exercise to the utmost their powers of conciliation, the deadlock remains unbroken between Premier Herriot of France and the American-Anglo bankers over the formula by which to safeguard the proposed loan to Germany.

Moscow, July 25. The soviet government has appropriated \$32,000,000 to cope with the threatened famine, according to an announcement today by the central committee of the Communist party.

Ann Arbor, Mich., July 25. Philippine independence is the greatest moral reconstruction problem the United States has to deal with, Dean Kalaw of the University of the Philippines, who is exchange professor at the University of Michigan, told the Institute of Government Politics today.

Washington, July 26. According to reports received at Washington, General Averesco has overthrown the Bratiano government of Roumania.

Buenos Aires, July 26. Reports reaching here tonight contradict the Rio Janeiro communiques that the revolution is confined to the state of Sao Paulo.

It is reported the federal government has declared a state of siege in five states and that the federal garrison of Sergipe has mutinied.

London, July 25. Observers tonight saw an unmistakable hardening in the attitude of all delegates to the Interallied Conference against submitting to the dictation of the international

bankers in formulating a protocol to launch the Dawes plan.

The French are not yielding an inch toward surrender of their rights under the Versailles treaty, and it is increasingly evident that neither Premier Macdonald of England nor Premier Herriot of France intend to sign anywhere the bankers point their fingers.

Paris, July 26. King Alfonso of Spain and John D. Rockefeller were today elected foreign associate members of the Academy of Fine Arts as distinguished patrons.

Riga, July 26. A pogrom in which fifteen Jews were killed occurred on a Russian boat on the Djesna River, according to a Jewish Telegraph agency. An organized band picked out the Jews, brutally murdered them and threw the bodies into the river.

London, July 28. Colonel James A Logan, American adviser to American Ambassador Kellogg, today offered a compromise suggestion which lessened the tension in the interallied conference.

The French announced that they believed they would be able tomorrow to submit a formula that will be satisfactory to the British experts and the Anglo-American bankers. Consequently the experts conference adjourned until tomorrow.

Buenos Aires, July 28. Withdrawal of the rebels from Sao Paulo was followed by severe fighting Sunday.

The rebels made a desperate effort to hold back the federals, but failed. At daybreak today the federals brought up tanks followed by infantry. The

rebels had begun a retreat when the assault was made.

London, July 28. Many signs of the pending developments in Greece point in the direction of the restoration of the monarchy, according to the Daily Express.

That paper says the royalists who joined hands with the supporters of Eleutherios Venizelos, former premier of Greece, believe a counter revolution is imminent and that King George will be restored to the throne of Greece.

London, July 29. The interallied conference dragged along today without making much progress. No formal committee meetings were held but there were many informal conferences.

Barcelona, Spain, July 29. Isauro Gabaldon, Philippine resident commissioner at Washington, who is visiting Europe in behalf of Philippine independence, in a statement today said:

"Never before were our hopes for the triumph of the cause so well founded. Any country that knows our desires must become a partisan of Philippine aspirations".
