Ojeda, Villafuerte Belie Visual Progress in Naga City under LP

Ex-Mayor Victorino L. Ojeda and former Vice-Mayor Mariano R. Villafuerte Jr. yesterday rallied all city Nacionalistas to unite in a common effort for a political crusade that will eventually bring them back to power after the November polls.

Ojeda and Villafuerte headed the political combine that gave local NPs political control over the city administration after winning the '59 elections.

The two NP leaders emphasized the need of defeating the Liberal party ticket led by Mayor Vicente P. Sibulo to establish an eventual tieup with President Marcos' progress goals for local governments.

An overall program for city development could only be fully realized if the NPs win in the coming polls here, the two said. For the LPs to speak now of implementing a coordinated progress plan for the city after the '67 elections would be "a mere political catch-on" because Mr. Marcos is still in Malacanang for the next two years, Ojeda and Villafuerte said.

Ojeda recalled that all the LP's claims for "originality" in completing vital projects like the city market, public streetlighting, beautification and

U.S. Admiral To Visit 'Sailor Town' In Southern Luzon

U.S. NAVAL BASE, Subic Bay (PAO) — Nabua, a town in Camarines Sur province noted for its many active and retired U.S. Navy personnel, will throw wide open its doors for an American admiral next week.

Rear Admiral Fillmore B. Gilkerson, commander of this Seventh Fleet logistics support installation, will be in the landlocked municipality of 80,000 inhabitants on Wednesday, Oct. 4.

He will be on a People-to-People mission for his government, at the same time swapping naval memories with some of the town's 140 retired U.S. Navy men.

America's People-to-People Program, a worldwide project instituted during the Eisenhower administration, has gone far and wide in the Philippines. One of the more

the provincial capital at 10:30 for the 50-minute overland ride to Nabua.

The admiral and party will have lunch at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ricardo B. Orias, parents of Ely U. Orias who serves on the public affairs staff of Admiral Gilkeson.

After lunch the visitors will make a one-hour tour of Nabua, with glimpses of homes of active and retired USN personnel residing in the poblacion.

By mid-afternoon official ceremonies start, with Admiral Gilkeson presenting Project Handclasp materials from the American people to Nabua High School, the poblacion's primary and elementary schools, and the municipal health center. Some underprivileged children, designated by a local charitable organization will also receive dolls and other toys.

The Americans donation consists of library and text books, athletic equipment, medical supplies, home economics materials, paint and toys.

The day's festivities will be capped with a dinner-dance in the admiral's honor to be sponsored by the municipal council, teachers and members of the local Fleet Reserve Association and their ladies. Speeches, folk dances and exchange of token gifts will highlight the affair.

Admiral Gilkeson will speak, underscoring Nabua's contribution of personnel to the service of the different branches of the U.S. armed forces.

Some 278 sons of Nabua, for example, are currently serving in various capacities in the U.S. Navy. Around 140 have preceded them and are now comfortable retired. Others are in the U.S. Coast Guard while a few are with the U.S. Army, U.S. Air Force and U.S. Marine Corps.

The Subic visitors will depart Nabua for Naga City midnight of Oct. 4 for their overnight billets at the Holiday Hotel in the provincial capital. A breakfast the following day is scheduled for Admiral Gilkeson with Gov. Malena, Mayor Sibulo, City Fiscal Luis B. Uvero, Father Candelaria of Ateneo de Naga, and other officials.

After breakfast, Admiral Gilkeson and party will head for P-1 where the Subic Commander's HU-16, an amphibious aircraft, awaits them for the flight back to Zambales.

lion BTTI tourist tax income not one centavo has been spent to develop tourist spots in Cebu, Bicolandia, Mindanao or Northern Luzon. The governor asked why 76% of BTTI funds are spent on personnel and administration leaving hardly 24% to tourism development and promotion.

Balablat lamely tried to ease out by explaining that BTTI funds were used to develop Lueta, Fort Santiago, Parian Gate, Pao Cemetery and a P2 million hotel in Corregidor.

But Frivaldo floored him by revealing that the P2 million to put up the hotel in Corregidor was not BTTI funds but borrowed from the bank, that the public understands the Lueta, Intramuros, Fort Santiago and Pao Cemetery were the work of Doroy Valencia and Mrs. Imelda Marcos, but hardly BTTI.

The governor added that BTTI is top heavy with commissioners, deputy commissioners, technical assistants and 300 employees and casuals. Frivaldo said the board members and commissioners receive P3,000 monthly allowance compared to the P6,000 annually received by former tourism commissioner Modesto Farolan.

Frivaldo's last salvo was despite government efforts to invite foreign investors, we fail not only to attract foreign capital but instead Filipino capital have been steadily flying out of the country. Frivaldo said a Filipino industrialist have invested heavily in Australia, two Filipino businessmen have set up two home appliances factories in Hongkong, two big hotels in Hongkong are owned or partly owned by Filipinos, the millions of profits from a plush Makati subdivision have been reinvested in a rich residential district in Sevilla and Barcelona, Spain.

The governor bewailed even in troubled Indonesia two big Filipino businessmen and insurance companies have invested heavily. Why cannot these local capital be invested in our own young and poor country, Frivaldo asked. Why? why, Frivaldo shouted.

Rural Health needs mulled

President Marcos has instructed Health Secretary Paulino Garcia to conduct a seminar on rural health to indoctrinate the people in the rural areas to sanitary and more wholesome living.

The President called representatives of private organizations engaged in rural health work to a conference recently in Malacang, to coordinate with government efforts in meeting the health needs of the rural population.

"Rural medicine has taken a back seat" in public awareness, with the press virtually ignoring it," the President pointed out in his brief remarks to the conferees.

The President said that the progress and problems of this area of development have not been appropriately appreciated because not much information has been disseminated on this.

The private organizations represented in the conference included the Chamber of Philippine Drug Manufacturers, the Philippine Pharmaceutical Association, the Drug Association of the Philippines, the Philippine Pharmaceutical and Drug Manufacturers, the Philippine Medical Association, the National League of Puericulture Centers, the Catholic Welfare Organization, the League of Health and Medical Administration of the Philippines, the Philippine Mental Health Association, the National Council of Churches in the Philippines and the Colleges of Medicine of UST, FEU, MCU and UE.

Other agencies represented at the meeting were the PACD, the US-AID, the UNICEF, and the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office.

The President enjoined those at the conference to enlist the help of the barrio people, who should willingly extend their assistance, he said, once they realize that they are the ultimate beneficiaries of the rural health program.

The President said that he hopes to improve the entire atmosphere in the rural communities.

The President noted that indigency burdens 70 to 80 per cent of the rural areas, thus full coordination of government and private efforts is very much needed. This situation, he said, prompted him into calling the conference, which primarily explored the ways to tighten coordination between the private sector and the government.

The President observed that many government workers do not have the necessary enthusiasm to energize their work, but added he has "complete trust in our Secretary of Health."

He said that "I have a very great interest in rural health not only because it is my duty, but because it is my intention to increase and give the best possible assistance in meeting the health needs of the people, especially the poor."

He recalled that when still a congressman, he participated actively in the passage of legislation creating rural health units.

The President said that the present program of the Philippine Medical Association complements the activities of rural health teams. He asked the private sector to provide not only the facilities but also the personnel needed in rural health work.

The President expressed the hope that the private sector will immediately increase their participation in the rural health effort.

The President concluded his remarks by saying that "you are in a better position to tell me what should be done." He added, "this appraisal is needed to define the national direction and it is my duty to call your attention to this need."
