

Urges Philippine Islands To Keep Spanish Heritage

A visiting professor from Stanford University, California, who arrived yesterday strongly urged the Filipinos to preserve the Spanish culture in the Philippines.

The visitor, Dr. Alfred Coester, professor of allied subjects dealing on the Spanish occupation

of America, arrived on board the *m. s. Boiservain* from Europe. He is staying here four days in the course of a world cultural tour.

"The Philippines", he said, "is rich in Spanish culture because of the three centuries of Spanish occupation. Your country can well be proud of this heritage".
