Prov. Board To Restore Old H.S. Fee

Objectives of Pres. Marcos U.S. Visit Bared; Working Entourage Limited

Malacañang declared that the Presidential state visit to the United States, scheduled for September 12, will be working visit, as borne out by the spare list of official members of the party, each carefully handpicked for maximum service during the visit.

The official party, including President Marcos, the First Lady Mrs. Imelda R. Marcos, number exactly 8 members.

The unofficial members include six assistants and aides and representatives of various Manila newspapers who were chosen by their respective editors and publishers.

Malacañang further said that the President himself will be busy throughout the visit, which has been closely programmed to deal with the urgent problems which necessitated the trip to Washington.

The President had earlier spec-

ified the reasons for the state visit, topped by discussions on the policy level of matters affecting Philippine-US relations.

Notable among these are the up-dating of the agreement on the US military bases here, implementation of the military assistance Pact in the light of recent developments, the mutual defense treaty, and other basic policies that only the two heads of state could decide.

The unofficial members were similarly selected for maximum assistance to the President, and consist of aides and special technicians. (Continued on page 4)

Extra Train To Run On P'frañcia Festa

Nicanor T. Jimenez, general manager of the Philippine National Railways, announced yesterday the schedule of special trains on September 16 to 18 from Manila to Naga and other extra trains in the Bicol region effective September 15 to 21 during the feast of Our Lady of Penafrañcia.

On Friday September 16, extra train MA-1 will run from Manila to Naga as first section of the Bicol Night Express train 514, leaving Manila at 5:30 p.m. to arrive Naga at 3:45 a.m., the next morning. On Sunday Sept. 18, extra train NG-4 will run from Naga to Manila as first section of Night Express train 514, leaving Naga at 7:00 p.m. to arrive Manila at 5:30 a.m. the following day.

Gov. Maleniza, Board Members Accede to PTA, Students Demands

Provincial Governor Apolonio G. Maleniza and majority of the board members acceded to the demands of the Cam. Sur high school PTA and students to restore the old tuition fee of ₱85 in the high school here.

Last August 10, the C.S. provincial Board in its regular session approved Resolution No. 381 raising the tuition fee in the high school from ₱85 to ₱105 or more than 20 per cent raise. Vice Gov. Felimon Odiamar was absent. Thus the high school PTA and students protested which culminated to the march of the PTA and students to the capitol with placards demanding from the Prov. Board to reduce the tuition fee or restore the old rate as well as to raise the salaries of the C.S. high school teachers who are receiving less than ₱200 a month.

Gov. Maleniza arrived at the Capitol Annex Bldg. when the big crowd of parents and students were gathered on the ground in already (Continued on page 12)

Joint Legislative Executive Tax Commission To Make Finance Survey Here Sept 12-28

The local finance survey under the sponsorship and direction of the Joint Legislative-Executive Tax Commission with the cooperation of the provincial and municipal governments of Albay and the city governments of Legazpi and Naga will be held in the cities of Legazpi and Naga starting September 12 and ending on September 28, 1966.

Before the province of Albay and the cities of Legazpi and Naga, the survey was conducted in the province of Tausog from August 18 to 31, 1966.

The general objective of the survey is to delve into the complicated problems of local finances and decentralization, and to obtain views on possible reforms. To obtain information on the present decentralization proposal and to gather other ideas not embodied in the Senate Bill No. 1; 2) to obtain opinions on the proposed automatic retention scheme and apportionment of internal revenue collection; 3) to determine the effectiveness of present assessment and collection methods in the real property taxation, and to get views on possible reforms; 4) to obtain information on the present (Continued on page 12)

PN Bolstered With U.S. Patrol Boat

MANILA - Transfer of four high speed patrol boats to the Philippines by the United States "will substantially increase our Navy's capability in its sea defense efforts," says Alfonso Arellano, Philippine Defense Undersecretary.

The boats, called "swift-erats" for their high speed and maneuverability, were transferred in a ceremony here August 31. Capt. James R. Wines, chief of the Joint U.S. Military Assistance Group, turned them over to Undersecretary Arellano. Delivery was made in response to a request from the Philippine Government.

Mr. Arellano said the turnover not only highlighted the close cooperation between the two countries but "more importantly, the Navy's acquisition of compact and fast patrol craft will now enable it to wage a more determined and unrelenting campaign against those who use the sea lanes for their nefarious ends."

Two other boats of similar design were delivered last March by U.S. Ambassador William McC. Binn, Jr. to the Philippine Maritime Forces. The boats are outfitted with radar and radio equipment and heavy machine guns.

CSHS Old Tuition Fee Restored; Demonstrators Satisfied

CS Prov'l Board Drew the IRE of the CSHS PTA

In protest against the hiking of the tuition fee in Cam. Sur High School from P85 to P110 effective this school year, the members of the CSHS PTA, together with a school children representing the entire student body of the provincial high school here, staged a dramatic public demonstration against the Cam. Sur Provincial Board last Tuesday morning. Governor Malena gave an explanation and expatiated the Provincial Board.

It was gathered, that the provincial board in approving last August 10th the revised Budget and Plantilla of the Cam. Sur High School passed Resolution No. 381 which in effect also authorized the increasing of the CSHS tuition fee by almost 25 per cent. Usual sources revealed that the hiking of the tuition fee to P110 is an amount of the demand of the CSHS faculty for the up-dating of their salaries which are even very much below the standard salary of an elementary school teacher. What angered the parents of the provincial high school students is the fact that while they are already assuming the entire financial burden of the school operation without any

aid from the provincial government they would still be made to assume additional load by the promulgation of said Resolution No. 381.

Apparently outraged as were a little bit embarrassed, Gov. Malena and other members of the provincial Board could not do otherwise but to accede to the demand of the demonstrators for the amendment of the controversial resolution so as to restore the school tuition fee to its original amount of P85. The provincial Board stated in its predicament as to how they will achieve the adjustment of the CSHS teachers' salaries, since no additional tuition fee is going to be collected contrary to their expectations and plans.

Meanwhile, some officers of the CSHS PTA denounced the City Government for its indifference to their demonstration as manifested by the policemen who vehemently refused to redirect at least temporarily, the vehicular traffic within the route of the demonstrators. Even with the actual presentation of the Mayor's Permit to the policemen concerned, they still refused "because there was no order given" by immediate superior, it was learned. As a result, the demonstrators have been broken-up several times out of their lines. After several minutes the traffic and the demonstrators were stalled in the streets near the frontage of the provincial capitol, and the Plaza Quezon. The only member of the provincial Board who seems amused about the CSHS PTA demonstration is Vice Governor Odiamar. Informed sources disclosed that Odiamar was not present when the provincial Board deliberated on and approved Resolution No. 381. It would have been a different story had he been present, the informant said. - F.A.

AGM, The Prov'l. Board, And The CSHS PTA

The CSHS PTA strongly manifested its protest against the hiking of the tuition fee in the provincial High School effective this school year as contained in the provision of Provincial Board resolution No. 381. The PTA, members together with their children staged a public demonstration last Tuesday morning.

Incidentally, that public demonstration of the CSHS PTA revealed some interesting facts quite unexpectedly. Firstly, it shows that the CSHS PTA is composed of and managed by parents who are not afraid to stand up and speak for their rights; secondly, it revealed the attitude of the City Government towards public demonstrations such as that one, as manifested by the indifference of the traffic cops manning the traffic within the route of the demonstrators (notwithstanding the Permit granted by the Mayor); thirdly, it shows some sort of demagogism on the part of some of our provincial leaders.

Inasmuch as the Parents of the CSHS students are the ones actually providing for the finances of the CSHS operation out of the present tuition fee of P85, they consider it UNFAIR, UNKIND, and IMPRUDENT on the part of the provincial Board in increasing the tuition fee to P105 without the parents' knowledge and expressed consent.

To our Witness, such act manifests INSULT added to INJURY. Why indeed? Should the provincial Board impose additional burden to the parents of the CSHS students when the Parents are solely shouldering the budgetary responsibility in the CSHS without the aid of the provincial government.

The Governor however, in the course of his response to the CSHS PTA demand, together with the other members of the provincial Board, have made it clear that their will be no change in the amount (P85.00) of the school tuition fee. Nevertheless, the original problem, the adjustment of the CSHS teachers' salaries, is far from solved.

Altho the matter of how to attain the adjustment of the CSHS teachers' salaries is not his own problem, our witness suggests that the would be solution should start from the re-examination of the school as well as that of the provincial budget. Our witness believes that the reversion of some "not so important" items in the current budget from its original proposal to the adjustment of the teachers salaries, will not necessarily hamper the normal operation of the Cam. Sur High School nor the provincial government.

The last resort however, after all avenues have been explored to attain that end, is to turn-over the administration of the Cam. Sur High School to the PARENT-TEACHERS ASSOCIATION.

BPS Not Complying With Rep. Act 4670 Charges Senator Padilla

Senate Minority Floor Leader Ambrosio Padilla charged the Bureau of Public Schools in not complying with Rep Act No. 4670, otherwise known as the "Magna Charta for Public School Teachers."

One of the bills passed by Congress during the last session and approved by President Marcos on June 18, 1966, is Rep. Act No. 4670. This Act shall be known as the "Magna Charta for Public School Teachers" (Sec. 2), and is pursuant to the "Declaration of Policy" (Sec. 1), it provides for "Tenure of Office," "Stability on employment and security of tenure shall be assured the teachers as provided under existing laws" (Sec. 5).

The particular provision of said Rep. Act No. 4670 that is being flagrantly violated by the Bureau of Public Schools thru its superintendents academic supervisors, district supervisors and principals in-charge in many provinces are 1. Sec. 4, it transfers of teachers mainly due to political pressures and considerations. Obvious 1; those transfer run counter to Section 6 of said Rep. Act No. 4670, which provides:

"Sec. 6. Consent for Transfer - Transferral of Teachers - Except for cause and as herein otherwise provided, no teacher shall be transferred without his consent from one station to another."

Some transfers also violate Section 11 of said Rep. Act No. 4670, more particularly on married teachers. Thus, Sec. 11 provides:

"Sec. 11. Married Teachers - Whenever possible, the proper authorities shall take all steps to employ married couples both of whom are public school teachers, to be employed in the same locality."

The lame excuse of the Bureau of Public Schools is that Rep. Act No. 4670 is not yet in force, supposedly because Sec. 30 thereof provides for "rules and regulations" to be promulgated by the Secretary of Education shall take effect thirty (30) days after publication.

It is elementary that rules and regulations cannot contravene the provisions of the statute for they are presently intended to implement provisions merely as to minor details.

Republic Act No. 4670 was enacted into law on June 18, 1966. The Executive Department is duty bound to comply with the provisions of said law, otherwise they may incur the penal provision in Sec. 32 thereof which reads:

"Sec 32 Penal Provision - A person who shall wilfully interfere with, restrain or coerce any teacher in the exercise of his rights guaranteed by this Act or who shall in any other manner commit any act in violation of the provisions of this Act shall, upon conviction, be punished xxx."

I have received many complaints from teachers in many provinces, particularly Leyte

and Samar, protesting against unauthorized transfer motivated by political considerations which, under Sec. 6 of Rep. Act No. 4670, are illegal, because a teacher cannot be transferred without his consent from one station to another, except for cause as provided for in said Act.

I urge this administration, which professes adherence to the rule of law, to set the example of complying with the provisions of Rep. Act No. 4670, especially the officials of the Bureau of Public Schools and of the Department of Education.

U.S. Has No Plans to Increase Vietnam Troops to 600,000

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS —High-level U.S. military commanders in Vietnam have not recommended that U.S. troop strength in South Vietnam be raised to 600,000.

This was disclosed August 20 by White House Press Secretary Assistant George Christian at a morning news briefing.

He was asked about a press report from Saigon that leading military strategists, charged with the long range planning of the war effort, are thinking in terms of building a force of 600,000 troops.

Mr. Christian said, in response to the question:

"The Secretary of Defense (Robert S. McNamara), has advised us he has not received any recommendation" for the reported escalation of troop strength.

PFM Orders Disbandment of Non-Salaried Policemen

President Marcos ordered the disbandment of police officers and special agents working without compensation, even as he took steps to solve the problem of police abuse on the nation's highways which have victimized truck drivers and other motorists.

his order all such personnel still in harness and confiscate their firearms and prosecute them for "unauthorized possession of firearms" or other violations of the law.

The President also directed local officials to hear down hard on legitimate police officers found to be harassing motorists, truck drivers, merchants and the public at large, on the country's highways.

He asked that governors and mayors exercise tighter control over their police forces, including the weeding out of incompetents and undesirable from police ranks.

He also directed that in the case of arrests or apprehensions for violations of the Land Transportation and Traffic Code, all police officers should comply strictly with the requirements of the law, particularly in the case of traffic violation cases be endorsed immediately for action to the proper traffic courts or other courts having jurisdiction.

In addition, he asked that traffic violation cases be endorsed immediately for action to the proper traffic courts or other courts having jurisdiction.

To further insure the proper utilization of traffic violation receipts or temporary operators permits the President asked that all such forms be validated with the LTC.

In calling for the dissolution of all "special" policemen, the President pointed out that the actual order disbanning these functionaries was issued as far back as April 13, 1960, when Malabon issued a provincial circular to all provincial, city and municipal executives to this effect.

The President in his present directive declared that the "present and past performance" of these peace officers "leave much to be desired."

He underlined the many indiscretions committed by the said special law enforcement officers, including exploitation by politicians, local vested interests, and on their own initiative in involvement with cases of mulcting, extortion and abuse of authority.

He said that the activities of many of these men have proved to be inimical to the present "peace and order drive."

In the same order, he instructed the Philippine Constabulary chief to arrest with in 30 days after receipt of

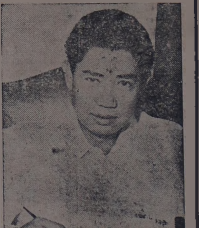

Appeal to the CHSIS Alumni

We Need Camarines Sur Naga City Educational Center

(By the CHSISAA Committee on Solicitation)

The proposed Educational Center will soon be constructed in the city of Naga. This building will stand on the eastern side of the present Division Office at Peña Francis Avenue inside the C.S. High school compound. The present Provincial Board has donated a six-hundred square-meter lot for this building with a frontage of thirty-five meters. As soon as the donation papers are perfected, the construction will begin. The three associations CHBSAA, CASTRA and FACETE will finance the construction estimated to cost more than one hundred fifty thousand pesos.

Why the Center?

This Educational Center is necessary because it was felt that during the yearly alignment home-coming of the CHS-HBAA teachers conventions and other educational societies in Naga City and in the province, the requirements of private institutions are used. The present CHSIS library is now too small for this affair. Even the grandstands are not safe in the present needs. When the center building is constructed, the local chapters of national educational associations may be given adequate headquarters, for example, the Camarines Sur Home Economics Teachers Association, the Future Home-makers of the Philippines, the Science Teachers Association of the Philippines, the Philippine Family Life Workers, etc.

The important records of many offices needed for educational research are only thrown away and there is a repository for the vital materials at present. School records are being lost every year due to floods, fire, and other calamities. Imagine the compiled records of Bikol folklore submitted after liberation by hundreds of laymen and teachers throughout the Division of Camarines Sur which are where to be found due to the lack of space in the present Division Office building. This compilation of vital educational materials for Bikol culture will find permanent home in our Center.

Then comes the donation of hundreds of volumes of books, pamphlets, encyclopedias and other general reading coming from abroad solicited by teachers from educational foundations and from peace-loving relatives who are expected to be assigned in this province. These vast materials are good for references and such materials may be used by our students, teachers, parents, and researchers.

The big problem is where to house these voluminous reference materials. Again, this Center will answer this need. Donations from private individuals and collections coming from other sources may find their place too in this edifice. While libraries are public and private libraries in Naga City, the Center may ultimately be used as clearing house in the future.

Can be a Show Window? The Center it is believed,

Two governmental officials and two faculty members of a Manila medical school departed recently for the United States to undergo specialized training, sponsored jointly by the National Economic Council (NEC) and U.S. Agency for International Development (U.S. AID). Laguno, a technical assistant for information, will participate in 15 months of schooling and field observations in mass communication with emphasis on publications, radio and TV media. He will attend a specialized course at Michigan State University, East Lansing, Mich.

Both Blas and Laguno are lawyers and live in Quezon City. Blas is from Laong City, Laguna. Laguno is from Daraga, Albay. Dr. Agatep will receive specialized instruction in the Medical College of Virginia, Richmond, Va.; and Dr. Forjas in physiology at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine, White-Salem, N.C. Each course of study is for two years.

The two MCU instructors, who have been granted fellowships under the NEC-U.S. AID program, will also serve department organization and teaching techniques in medical schools, and attend national meetings and conferences related to their fields.

More Nations ask U Thant To Stay in Office

UNITED NATIONS—Expression of support for U Thant and requests that he remain as Secretary General of the United Nations continue to pour in. On August 30, just two days before U Thant has promised to announce whether he will make himself available for another term, the Secretary of the Malaya Union expressed the hope that he would stay on. The fourteen states in the union are Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Congo (Brazzaville), Democratic Republic of the Congo, Dahomey, Gabon, Ivory Coast, Malaya, Republic, Niger, Rwanda, Senegal, Togo and Upper Volta.

The same day, another communication was received from the foreign minister of Mali (Mali) Nida Bata, expressing similar sentiments and asking U Thant to continue his work.

Representatives of numerous other African and Asian countries as well as the Western European nations and the major powers of France, United Kingdom, Soviet Union and the United States have previously requested that the Secretary General make himself available for another term in office.

RCA Probe Ordered
By President Marcos

Pres. Marcos today ordered the recall of personnel of the Rice and Corn Administration found to have been involved in any irregularities, including electioneering for any political party in the last elections.

The President called for this further action in addition to the charges already filed by the RCA against employees found to have illegally profited from illicit purchases of cement estimated at the amount of P30 million.

The order to weed out corrupt employees in the rice and corn firm was issued by the President after persistent representations from various sectors, including senators and congressmen, for the prosecution of officials and employees in the case against who were involved in irregularities in the distribution of rice and were causing huge losses to the government.

"You are directed to screen the officials and employees of the Rice and Corn Administration and weed out all those involved in irregularities," the President told Colonel Omando Mendozono, RCA administrator.

The President told Mendozono that Malacnang has been furnished with reports of the investigations conducted to ascertain the culpability of RCA personnel. The reports indicated that many employees were found to be liable to prosecution or dismissal from the agency.

The President required immediate compliance with the order and asked for a report on the action taken by Mendozono, including a receipt of his order.

In the meantime, the President set a minimum charge of ten centavos for the transmission of complaints and grievances of citizens to the Land Authority governor, in consultation with the implementation of the land reform program.

The minimum charge will apply to tele or other telegraphic services sent through or rendered by the Bureau of Telecommunications.

The President said that because of the importance of the land reform program, and due to the "manifold problems" that may be encountered in implementing it, it was essential for the proper authorities to pay the closest attention to any complaints or grievances from the public.

The benefits from the program, he added, can only be fully realized if the government sector diligently attended to all the complexities involved.

He asked the authorities concerned to make it easy for these complaints to reach their desk.

Hanoi V. Cong "Terrified Of Elections" Prospect

WASHINGTON - Secretary of State Rusk says the Hanoi regime and the Viet Cong are "terrified of the elections" to be held by the South Vietnamese September 11 to choose a constituent assembly.

The communists, said Mr. Rusk, know "any expression of solidarity among the South Vietnamese" will explore the feasibility of the "National Liberation Front's claim to speak for the South Vietnamese."

Mr. Rusk, addressing the American Legion Auxiliary, composed of wives of American legionnaires, warned on August 31 that Americans must not "suppose that if we turn our backs somebody else will act" to prevent communist aggression in Asia.

He emphasized, too, that a paramount purpose of the Johnson administration's foreign policy was "to secure

the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity. "If a hard choice has to be made between the liberty and peace, we shall choose liberty just as we have done in the past," the Secretary said.

Mr. Rusk said he was "quite aware" that Chinese communist party leader Mao Tse-Tung "is not Hitler" and that Peking's Defense Minister Lin Biao's September 1965, article "is a lot different," he cautioned, "should not be allowed to conceal the heart of the matter."

The Secretary of State said it would be "a tragedy for mankind if we were to forget the most important lessons leading up to World War Two, for we are not going to have the chance to draw the lessons from World War Three."

Mr. Rusk reiterated that the U.S. presence in South Vietnam is to repel North aggression and to assure the South Vietnamese people the choice of their own future. "When those objectives have been achieved, then we will withdraw," he said.

Penafrancia Festival & Tourism

All roads lead to Naga as a City come September every year. It is a festival of Our Lady of Penafrancia, the miraculous Virgin and patron Saint of Bisaya.

Bicolanos throughout the country always find time once a year to go to Naga City to pay homage to their Blessed Virgin. They come by land, water and air through the railroad, by sea and boats and by plane. There are also thousands of visitors from foreign lands and natives from various sections of the country who join the pilgrimage of the Bicolanos.

Due to the presence of varied tourist attractions in the Bicol region, most of these visitors never fail to take a look at the different natural, cultural and historical spots in Bicol.

The Board of Travel and Tourist Industry, Bicol regional office at Legaspi City, in its desire to help promote tourism, is extending its full cooperation with the officials of Naga, provincial officials of Camarines Sur, the Bicol Weekly newspapers and metropolitan publications disseminating information to tourists where they can go during their short sojourn at Naga City on the occasion of their pilgrimage to our Virgin of Penafrancia.

In Camarines Sur, for example, the travellers will find delight in seeing for themselves the historical "Quince Maers" monument in Naga City's possession. This is a memorial to the 15 Bicolano freedom fighters who gave up their lives for the cause of our country.

Also in Naga, worth visiting are the sprawling campus of University of the Philippines, the first university and best laid out school campus in the Bicol area; Colegio de Santa Isabel, the oldest and exclusive girls' institution in Bicol; the aged cathedral of Nueva Caceres; Nordia Lodge Resort and others.

The quaint and small sleepy town of Buhli in Camarines Sur is a "must" for tourists. It boasts of its placid lake, "La Roca Encantada", a mass of big boulders piled along the beach of the lake, its numerous waterfalls, which needs further government development; Buenavista Resort, a high promontory overlooking the lake, and "Labios", the smallest edible and commercial fish in the world.

Other places to see are the "grotto" of Our Lady of Lorraine on the top hill of Caramoran, the zigzag road of Siapoet leading to Daet, Bata Lake and the different islands along Sagay town, scene of some international movie location.

At nearby Alabay province, majestic Mayon Volcano becomes the visitors. The only five volcano in the world with a most perfect cone, Mayon serves as the symbol of Philippine tourism. Here, 2,509 feet above sea level, the government Board of Travel and Tourist Industry (BTTI), recently constructed a Malayan type mountain lodge costing P100,000 where tourists can pass their days and nights.

Equally interesting are the historic "Battle of Legaspi" supermarket, Puro white beach, Kalayukit black beach resort at Sto. Domingo, Ta-

baeo pier, Naglabong boiling lake, Tiwi hot springs resort, Jorana's "hanging roads", Roca-Monte's Diavoland in Tabaco, modern abaca stripping at barrio Pabun in Ligao, the buried church of Capawan, Daraga church on top of a hill and its "stairway to heaven", abaca handicraft industries, Kimantong's winding sky-view drive and Legaspi oil factory, a multi-million Philippine-American joint business venture that processes coconut into oil for export abroad.

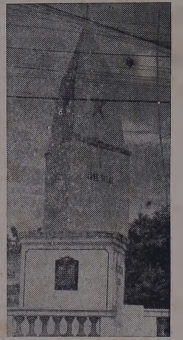
Sorsogon is another Bicol province that abounds with tourist attractions. Ferromot in Bulusan Lake, dubbed as the "Switzerland of the Philippines," The BTTI recently built a modern rest house here and constructed a cemented path along the Lovat's Lane where visitors can now walk around the lake with considerable ease and comfort. The BTTI also donated a twinmotorized fiberglass boat for use of tourists for a leisurely drive to the natural lake which is located high above mount Suluan.

Rizal white beach is another top attraction of Sorsogon. The BTTI also donated a pavilion for use of bathers and excursionists. Rep. Salvador Eustacia also built here a multi-million-peso hotel beach resort.

Other tourist spots of Sorsogon attracting domestic and overseas travellers all-year round are Maaserot medicinal swimming pool, San Benen Springs resort, the Old Iroin authentic shorbon that perched on the side of a hill, Sorsogon bay where the sunset rivals that of Manila in beauty, the well laid out lawn of the provincial capitol, Palih swimming resort, "Tolog Gapo" beach in Bacon and others.

Camarines Norte, another Bicol province, provides numerous attractions for the visitors.

by the Filipines in honor of Dr. Jose P. Rizal after he was shot at Bagumbayan, was built in Daet, the provincial capital.

Mercedes town has its long white beach which is favored among excursionists and visitors from outside the province. seed a pavilion. It has also the only wooden ship and boat building yards in Bicol.

At Pangasinan is located the government NASSCO steel shipyard. Its barge, Larap, is the site of the Philippine Iron Mines, one of the world's biggest of its kind.

Several of the tomas have gold deposits. Its mountains are rich in timber and wild game like deer, pigs and chickens.

A number of its municipalities are inhabited by negroes which a re a tourist attractions. The island province of Catanduanes is equally gifted with tourist spots. Known as "an island in the sun," it has long, white beaches. Facing the Pacific Ocean, the natives a their visitors both on its beaches shaded by swaying coconut trees or bask under the sun:

Top attraction of the province is Balongbong Waterfall. Situated at Ayudocan power, it is located in Bata town, a few kilometers from Virac, provincial capital. It provided with a swimming pool. This needs further improvement as this was destroyed by a series of typhoons that lashed Catanduanes during the past years.

There is also a historical cave between Virac and Calablon. It needs a flight of stairs in going down from the national road. A walking path should be constructed for tourists.

The cattle province of Bicol is Masbate. Being another island province; towns along the southeast are havin with long stretch of beaches. A small island near Masbate capital is surrounded by white beach which needs a pavilion for sea bathers and excursionists.

Catholic Relief Services donated 10,000 lbs. of relief clothing, Seventh Day Adventists and the Armed Forces of the Philippines gave clothing, food and medicines and several others.

Urgent appeals have been made to the base commander of the U.S. Navy in Subic Bay and in Bangley Point, to the Sorsogon Association, Bicol Development Planning Board, Jaycees, Philippine Chamber of Commerce.

On the government side, the Social Welfare Administration has given P8,000, the provincial Board appropriated P10,000 to buy a lot. The municipal council has promised another P10,000 counterpart while Congressman Vicente L. Perala has reportedly sought P200,000 from President Marcos for the fire victims.

Plans for the victims is to purchase a 3-hectare area in Balogo to be subdivided at 150 to 180-square-meter lots payable at P1 per year for ten to 20 years. They will be assisted with the framework and the roof but they will complete the building themselves. Construction of roads, sewerage, social hall, school, market will be undertaken by civic groups, Food for Peace and the government.

By and large, rehabilitation for the fire victims will lie more closely on the self-help basis.

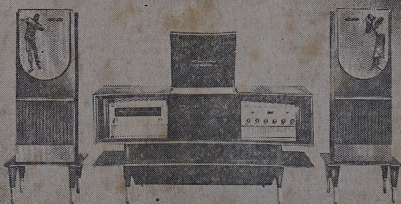
