

Those entitled to psyment are already known and will receive their payment through the Veterans Claims Settle-ment Office, Department of National Defense, Fort Aguinaldo.

Among those who witnes-sed the signing were Senator Jose Roy. Undersecretaries of Defense Manuel Syquie and Manuel Salientes. Assistant Executive Succetary Gilberto Duavit who represented the President, Alfredo G. Alvarez, PVB sesistant vice-president and Augustus Calantuan, vice-president auditor.
