### Ojeda, Villafuerte Belie Visual Progress in Naga City under LP

Ex-Mayor Victorino L. Ojeda and former Vice-Mayor Mariano R. Villafuerte Jr. yesterday rallied all city Nationalistas to unite in a common effort for a political crusade that will eventually bring them back to power after the November polls.

Ojeda and Villafuerte headed the political combine that gave local NPs political control over the city administration after winning the '59 elections.

The two NP leaders emphasized the need of defeating the Liberal party ticket led by Mayor Vicente P. Sibulo to establish an eventual tieup with President Marcos' progress goals for local governments.

An overall program for city development could only be fully realized if the NPs win in the coming polls here, the two said. For the LPs to speak now of implementing a coordinated progress plan for the city after the '67 elections would be "a mere political catch-on" because Mr. Marcos is still in Malacanang for the next two years, Ojeda and Villafuerte said.

Ojeda recalled that all the LP's claims for "originality" in completing vital projects like the city market, public streetlighting, beautification and

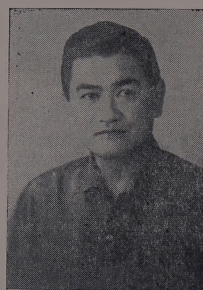

Commerce Secretary Marcelo Balatbat recently tried hard to enlighten

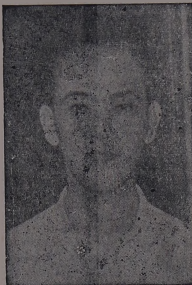
the Cebu Jaycees on what the government is doing to develop tourism but got burned in a searing open forum.

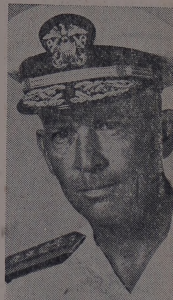
### U.S. Admiral To Visit 'Sailor Town' In Southern Luzon

U.S. NAVAL BASE, Subic Bay (PAO) — Nabua, a town in Camarines Sur province noted for its many active and retired U.S. Navy personnel, will throw wide open its doors for an American admiral next week.

Rear Admiral Fillmore B. Gilkerson, commander of this Seventh Fleet logistics support installation, will be in the landlocked municipality of 80,000 inhabitants on Wednesday, Oct. 4.

He will be on a People-to-People mission for his government, at the same time swapping naval memories with some of the town's 140 retired U.S. Navymen.

America's People-to-People Program, a worldwide project instituted during the Eisenhower administration, has gone far and wide in the Philippines. One of the more

Trust Agreement Signed

President Marcos has authorized the Trust Agreement between the RP-US Joint Veterans Commission and the Philippine Veterans Bank for the \$31-million veterans benefits claims.

The agreement was formally signed at the Osmeña Suite of D' Plaza, in Makati, Rizal.

Former Senator Eulogio Balso chairman of the Philippine panel, signed on behalf of the RP-US Joint Commission and Rafael Araldy, acting president of the Philippine Veterans Bank, signed for the part of the PVB.

The payment of the \$31 million veterans benefits claims was embodied in the Executive Agreement signed by Secretary of Foreign Affairs Narciso Ramos and Ambassador William McCornick Blair, Jr in Manila on June 29, 1967 and recently turned over to the Philippine government.

The benefit claims will accrue to the more than 600,000 Filipino veterans who were members of the United States Forces in the Far East (USAFFFE) to which they were inducted at the outbreak of the Pacific war.

The amount will be used to pay certain claims for pay and allowances of recognized Philippine guerrillas which have previously deductions from the backpay of certain RP veterans.

Those entitled to payment are already known and will receive their payment through the Veterans Claims Settlement Office, Department of National Defense, Fort Aguinaldo.

Among those who witnessed the signing were Senator Jose Roy, Undersecretaries of Defense Manuel Sique and Manuel Salicrú, Assistant Executive Secretary Gilberto Duavit who represented the President, Alfredo G. Alvarez, PVB assistant vice-president and Augustus Caintuan, vice-president, officer.

PWO Urges Conservation Education

The Political Pipeline

Buhi C.S. - In an impressive political rally on the proclamation of re-electionist Mayor Nazario Equizabal-former Ambassador Jose Fuentebella in his usual acatectic mood fired his first broadsides on the misconception of his stand on the gubernatorial question between his brother the Congressman Felix Fuentebella of the Second District of Camarines Sur and gubernatorial aspirant Atty. A. Cledera.

What amounts to be a spirited defense of the conduct of the Nacionalista Party convention at Abo Inam, Tignon a month ago - the Ambassador spelled in black and white his stiff opposition on the debates of the Junta to put up Congressman Felix Fuentebella as a compromise gubernatorial candidate.

The ambassador berated supposed detractors who would not stoop to incarnate the influence of disunioritary tactics thereby weakening the stand and chances of the party. He said he would not allow even his brother, the Congressman, to lampoon the dignity and the sacred intents of the convention. He added, the convention was glamorized with a Dei Gratia solemnization to the extent that cursillitas participated in a number together with the invocation calling for divine assistance from the Almighty as well as the spirits of the founding fathers of the party. He said the Congressman had assured him before the convention that he would not or is in any way interested in the gubernatorial post since being a congressman he could better serve his people than to be a receptionist governor.

Convinced on his stand on the majority result of the convention although short of the required 80% - the ambassador stressed no less than the President of the Philippines Ferdinand Marcos had called the NP Junta to act on the proclamation of Atty. Armando Cledera. He even cited the remarks of NP President Gil Puyat who said the case of Cledera is a special one since it involved the special attention of the President himself who is the titular head of the participating on the junta to act favorably on the proclamation of Atty. Armando Cledera.

The Ambassador added that if such a thing would happen that his brother would run - he said to preserve the spirit of the convention expressing the voice of the majority in a democracy - he would not vacillate to support the candidacy of Atty. Cledera. Of all the gubernatorial aspirants - Cledera has no relation to him whatsoever only that his forebears represented the founding fathers of the party. The Ambassador said that he would cross the province from end to end to tell the people the gospel of truth as the affirmation of his conviction that it would cost the ire of the whole NP junta including the President of the Philippines - He stressed further that for twenty years he fought the late President Manuel L. Quezon on a certain principle that Camarines Sur should stand on the solidity of the will of its people not a mere goose-stepping member of a legion who would not know to dissect between truth, justice, righteousness as against the meanness of the wrong-doer.

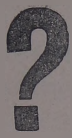


Underserving Question for Answers

**Rural Health needs mull'd**

President Marcos has instructed Health Secretary Paulino Garcia to conduct a seminar on rural health to indicate the needs of the rural areas to sanitary and more wholesome living.

The President called representatives of private organizations engaged in rural health work to a conference recently in Malacanan, to coordinate with government efforts in meeting the health needs of the rural population.

"Rural medicine has taken a back seat" in public awareness, with the press virtually ignoring it," the President pointed out in his brief remarks to the conferees.

The President said that the progress and problems of this area of development have not been appropriately appreciated because not much information has been disseminated on this.

The private organizations represented in the conference included the Chamber of Philippine Drug Manufacturers, the Philippine Pharmaceutical Association, the Philippine Pharmacy Manufacturers Association, the Philippine Medical Association, the National League of Puertic Culture Centers, the Catholic Welfare Organization, the League of Health and Medical Administration of the Philippines; the Philippine Mental Health Association, the National Council of Churches in the Philippines and the Colleges of Medicine of UST, FEU, MCU and UE.

Other agencies represented at the meeting were the PADCO the US-AID, the UNICEF, and the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office.

The President enjoined those at the conference to call the help of the barrio health workers who should be given their assistance, he said, once they realize that they are the ultimate beneficiaries of the rural health program.

The President said that he hopes to improve the entire atmosphere in the rural communities.

The President noted that the indigent burdens 70 to 80 per cent of the rural areas, thus full governmental involvement and private efforts is very much needed. This situation, he said, prompted him into calling the conference, which primarily explored ways to improve coordination between the private sector and the government.

The President observed that many government workers do not have the necessary enthusiasm to energize their work, but added he was "completing trust" on our Secretary of Health.

He said that "I have a very great interest in rural health not only because it is my duty, but because it is my intention to increase and give the best possible assistance in meeting the health needs of the people, especially the poor."

He recalled that when still a congressman, he participated in the passage of legislation creating rural health units.

The President program of the present government, the Philippine Medical Association compliments the activities of rural health teams. He asked the private sector to provide not only the facilities but also the personnel needed in rural health work.

The President expressed the hope that the private sector will immediately increase their participation in the rural health effort.

The President concluded his remarks by saying that "you are in a better position to tell me what should be done. It is up to you. The appraisal is needed to define the national direction and it is my duty to call your attention to this need."

Second Site For Rice Production Project Selected

Rice and Corn Production Coordinating Council (RCCPC) has selected the Binahaan-Tabak area in Leyte Norte as the site of the second rice production and extension project, President Marcos was informed recently.

The site was recommended by the joint Filipino-Chinese Team after conducting a survey of the area and favorably endorsed by Vice President and concurrently Secretary of Agriculture Fernando Lopez.

The implementation of the project will be undertaken by the Filipino-Chinese Agricultural Technical teams patterned after the Bahigu project.

The project site is located 18 kilometers west of Tacloban City with a spread of about 12 kilometers, along the national highway comprising Sta. Fe, parts of Palo, Pastrana and Alang-alang. It has a total acreage of over 10,000 hectares of which 2,400 hectares consist of irrigated rice paddies bounded by coconut plantations.

The survey team reported that the Palo clay loam, the type of soil found in the area, is considered suitable for cultivation of high yielding rice varieties (HYVs).

The Binahaan-Tibal area is characterized by the absence of a dry season with a pronounced rainfall from November to January.

The present average rice yield in the area is from 40 to 42 cavans per hectare. With the introduction of HYVs, harvest is expected to average about 80-100 cavans per hectare.

PAL Highly Praised By Gov. Frivaldo

Philippines Air Lines received high praises from Sorsogon Gov. Juan Frivaldo for opening the Manila-Legaspi-Cebu flights.

The governor said the new route would bring Bicolandia closer to Cebu economically, culturally and along tourist development. In the past Cebu passengers who desire to go to Legaspi and Bicolandia had to fly first to Manila then backtrack to Legaspi. In the same way, Bicolanos who desire to go to Cebu and Visayas had to fly first to Manila then head south.

Bicol officials and businessmen headed by Gov. Wenceslao Q. Vinzon, Legaspi City Mayor Luis Los Baños and Frivaldo found to their surprise that Cebu goods of similar kinds are cheaper than in Manila, that Bicol home industries products have big potential in the Visayas, and that trade between the two regions has bright potential.

Last week a group of Cebu businessmen, officials and civic leaders visited Bicolandia to explore its business and tourism potential. The trip was sponsored by PAL Gov. Rene Espina and Mayor Carlos Quison of Cebu, Jaycees, Lions, and other businessmen were included in the group of guests.

New Procedure in WAC Recruitment

Malacalang was informed recently of the revised procedure in recruitment of applicants from the provinces and other areas to the Women Auxiliary Corps (WAC).

The announcement was made by the General Headquarters, WAC detachment of the armed forces of the Philippines.

WAC officers, 2nd Lieutenant Restituta Matela and Perla Perlado, commanding officer and executive officer, respectively, said they requested officials of constabulary zones and military areas to help in the recruitment drive of the detachment.

The request included the authorization of the zones and military areas concerned in the processing of applications, giving out examinations and conducting physical and medical fitness tests.

This new procedure of recruitment is expected to bridge the distance between the recruiters and the recruits. It will also enable the AFP to choose from among a great number of young women the best of possible materials on whom to invest.

Only selected 40 applicants will be admitted finally to undergo training which starts November 1, to last for 13 weeks. This will bring to 80 the number of WAC enlisted women already working in the camp headquarters.

Recruitment will continue until the desired 120-man force has been constituted. Applicants should at least be high school graduates, 18-25 years old, 5'2" in height, Filipino citizens, of good moral character, single, and willing to stay unmarried during a three-year contract which they will sign. Training will consist of acquisition of skills that will enable them to do administrative, clerical, and technical work. They will fill up vacancies left by enlisted men and officers who have been assigned in the field to undertake civic action, engineering, anti criminality and peace and order missions.

lion BTTI tourist tax income not one centavo has been spent to develop tourist spots in Cebu, Biolaadia, Misamis or Northern Luzon. The governor asked why 74% of BTTI funds are spent on personnel and administration leaving hardly 24% to tourism development and promotion.

But what lately tried to ease out by explaining that BTTI funds were used to develop Luneta, Fort Santiago, Parian Gate, Pao Cemetery and a ₱2 million in Corregidor.

Frivaldo said the ward members and commissioners receive ₱3,000 monthly allowance compared to the ₱6,800 annually received by former tourism commissioner Modesto Foriano.

Frivaldo's last salvo was despite government efforts to invite foreign investors, we fail not only to attract foreign capital but instead Filipino capital have been simply flying out of the country. 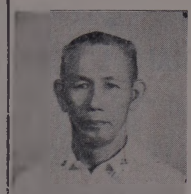
