

Los anglo-americanos ven tremendas dificultades en el ataque al Japon

Tokio, 19 de septiembre.—La Declaración Conjunta anglo-americana expedida después de la conferencia de Quebec y las declaraciones de Churchill y Roosevelt a los periódicos insinúan claramente que las discusiones más importantes durante la conferencia se concentraron en la temática contra el Japon y al mismo tiempo confiesan que los caudillos anglo-americanos afrontan serias dificultades en la preparación de la estrategia de ofensiva.

Así como los caudillos anti-Eje lanzaron una vocinglería publicidad acerca de sus deliberaciones en la conferencia de Teherán sobre los detalles de las operaciones militares contra Alemania, podemos tener la seguridad que el enemigo lanzara una campaña de publicidad idéntica sobre la conferencia de Quebec.

Sin embargo, un cuidadoso análisis de la Declaración Conjunta de las declaraciones de Roosevelt y Churchill a los periódicos, demuestra que a la par que los dos caudillos han propagado orgullosamente que el Japon será atacado hasta que se le arranque el último aliento, al mismo tiempo han reconocido ambas las abrumadoras dificultades envueltas en la traducción a la obra de los proyectados planes militares.

En primer lugar, por ejemplo, la Declaración Conjunta admite que la conferencia reunió largamente en los problemas sobre cuando y donde se concentrará el enorme ejército que será necesario para lanzar los ataques contra el Japon. Siempre nunca podrá ser un lugar tan adecuado como Bretaña fue cuando el anti-Eje lanzó la ofensiva contra Alemania. En China al anti-Eje jamás se le permitiera que efectuara una acumulación ilimitada y peligrosa de tropas igual a la que tuvo lugar durante las operaciones de desembarques en el Norte de Africa.

Roosevelt ha declarado que aunque el plan de ofensiva para aplastar al Japon ha sido ya decidido, no podía sin embargo revelar detalles concretos acerca de cuando había de efectuarse porque el no puede predecir cuando caerá Alemania. Esto es muy natural. El hecho de que la conferencia de Quebec solo ha sido una propaganda queda probado por esta última admisión.

La otra profunda impresión que dejó en uno las declaraciones de Roosevelt y Churchill es que el Primer Ministro inglés está esforzándose para hacer frente a la acusación de los países anti-Eje.

pequeños y en algunos sectores del público americano de que el interés de los ingleses en la ofensiva del Pacífico es considerablemente débil.

Roosevelt declaró ante los periodistas que la conferencia se efectuó con éxito y que se llegó a un perfecto acuerdo entre ambos países, mientras que Churchill fue mas allá al dar explicaciones verbales sobre el mismo tema, explicaciones que debieron mejor no haber sido dadas.

Su entrevista con los periodistas fué principalmente dedicada a los periodistas americanos y fácil es imaginarse que estos últimos hicieron cierto número de preguntas sobre la actitud inglesa con respecto a la política relacionada con la guerra del Pacífico. Estuporación del Premier Churchill

Churchill declaró que estaba estupefacto por los cargos de que Bretaña está evadiendo sus deberes en la Guerra del Pacífico y está dejando solo a los Estados Unidos para que cargue con toda la responsabilidad. Declarando que todo en la conferencia fué como sobre ruedas, Churchill añadió humorísticamente que el único caso en que los representantes anglo-americanos no congeniaron ocurrió cuando los Estados Unidos parecían querer apropiarse solo de la guerra del Pacífico no dando oportunidad a las fuerzas inglesas para luchar contra el Japon.

Aun cuando la guerra en Europa concluyese victoriosamente para el enemigo, se duda mucho de que Bretaña, con su fuerza militar agotada, pueda movilizar prontamente sus fuerzas en el teatro de guerra del Pacífico. Este es el punto que más preocupa a los Estados Unidos.

Aunque Roosevelt declaró que no se había fijado ninguna fecha para el lanzamiento de la siguiente ofensiva anti-japonesa, porque la fecha del colapso de Alemania no podía predecirse, la verdad es que no podía predecir la fecha porque le era imposible a Roosevelt leer en la mente de Churchill esta cuestión.

La verdad que la proclamación vocinglería del plan primero, y luego su traducción a la obra, es la táctica ordinaria de los anglo-americanos y estamos dispuestos a considerar la Conferencia de Quebec como una en la que se adoptó la estrategia que ha de emplearse contra el Japon. Sin embargo, recordamos bien que el Japon sigue teniendo en sus manos la clave de la situación.

SE INSISTE EN LO DE PEARL HARBOR

Un congresista pide se diga la verdad al público antes de las elecciones

Libaos, 18 de septiembre.—Un despacho de Washington dice que el Representante Harkness, republicano de Indiana, demandó en la Cámara este día que el Congreso practicara una investigación independiente de la debacle de Pearl Harbor donde todos los hechos del ataque japonés debieran ser revelados antes de que se celebren las elecciones presidenciales en Noviembre.

El Representante Harkness, que es miembro del Comité Militar de la Cámara, presentó una resolución pidiendo el nombramiento de un comité de cinco para practicar una investigación. Una disposición de la resolución es que el comité tendrá autoridad para exigir mediante subpoena "todos los records" de la Casa Blanca, del Departamento de Estado y del Ejército y la Armada, y para citar de igual modo al personal del Ejército y la Armada.

El Representante Harkness dijo: "Si el Presidente de los Estados Unidos no es responsable por este desastre, el debe ser prontamente exonerado de tan graves y serios cargos. Por otra parte, si como Comandante en Jefe de las fuerzas armadas él ha sido culpable de la dirección de las actividades militares en Hawaii, el pueblo americano debe conocer los verdaderos hechos antes de ser llamado a emitir su juicio sobre su cualificación para la reelección por cuarta vez como Presidente."

"La guerra con Japon se ha prolongado indebidamente y es imposible calcular las pérdidas de vidas y materiales que aún sufrimos en el Pacífico, en parte, si no del todo, debido a la estúpida y criminal negligencia de algunos que ocupan altos cargos", añadió el Representante Harkness.

DIMINUTAS PILAS SECAS PUEDE FABRICAR EL JAPON

Nagoya, 12 de septiembre.—Se ha revelado que diminutas pilas secas, del tamaño de una decima de las ordinarias, se pueden ahora fabricar. A pesar de su tamaño, la diminuta pila seca mantiene un alto voltaje.

La nueva pila ha sido fabricada por el Dr. Kumazō Sasaki, profesor de ciencias aplicadas en el Departamento de Ingeniería de la Universidad Imperial de Nagoya.

Se tiene entendido que, debido a su relativamente alto voltaje a pesar de su tamaño muy reducido, esta nueva pila seca resultará conveniente para su uso en aeroplanos y reflectores portátiles.

Aunque los materiales ordinarios como el manganeso, amoníaco, bronce y zinc, se usan para su manufactura, hay una diferencia significativa, a saber la clase de manganeso que se emplea en esta pila diminuta. Este metal posee ciertas cualidades descubiertas en el curso de un análisis cuidadoso.
