To Relocate Sorsogon Fire Victims; Aids to be given

Work started this morning on the relocation village for the 1,891 Sorsogon fire victims.

A survey team from the District Engineer's Office parceled out 3 hectares of a portion of the Jose Maria Sime property in Sipao into 150 square meters lot per family. The land was bought by the provinces.

Every lot owner will be assisted to build his home with the framing and the roof alone. He will have to complete the house himself. The lot will be paid for in painless installment of one peso per month.

Construction materials will come from the initial SWA aid of P8,000 and from voluntary contributions.

Vic Cruz, district governor of Lions International started the Lions kick-off drive in behalf of the fire victims with a P200 personal contribution. Appeals have been made to the Jaycees, the U.S. Navy authorities in Subic Bay and Saugley Point, the Jaycees, Philippine Chamber of Commerce; the Bicol Association; rotary, religious and civic groups.

Sorsogon Prisoners Taught Handicrafts

Provincial prisoners in the Sorsogon Provincial Jail are now producing in commercial quantities fine Acacia and Camagong wood carvings.

All these exquisite handicrafts are produced by the inmates as a project of the provincial government to make them earn their keep.

Provincial authorities are opening a display room at the Bicol Regional Trade Fair during the Penafrancia fiesta in Naga City.

Governor Frivaldo has likewise contrasted curio and souvenir shop owners in Manila for sale of these exquisite handicraft.

Interested buyers here and abroad may communicate with the Provincial Warden, Sorsogon, Sorsogon.

"Back-to-the-Farm": Counsels Frivaldo

Send your bright sons and daughter to the farms and to the colleges of agriculture, according to Sorsogon Gov Juan G Frivaldo.

In a meeting of farmers in Bulan organizing a credit union, Frivaldo lambasted the old tradition in which the most intelligent sons are sent to law or medical schools while the dullest are herded to agricultural schools. It should be the other way around. There should be a "back to the farm" movement in this country to feed our rampeping population.

Frivaldo also appealed to the government not to jeopardize other regions while the "Operation Central Luzon" is in progress. He said technicians have been pulled out from his province, equipment and funds allocation for Sorsogon have been reduced, his province was not included in Operation Spread and Sorsogon was by-passed in the photogrammetry survey. He has asked for this survey since 1957.

The governor said he supports the rice production program but other provinces producing other foods should be given similar encouragement. For instance Sorsogon is concentrating on dairy and livestock. It should be ex-

Hanoi V. Cong "Terrified Of Elections" Prospect

WASHINGTON - Secretary of State Rusk says the Hanoi regime and the Viet Cong are "terrified of the elections" to be held by the South Vietnamese September 11 to choose a constituent assembly.

The communists, said Mr. Rusk, know "any expression of solidarity among the South Vietnamese" will explore the falsity of the "National Liberation Front's claim to speak for the South Vietnamese."

Mr. Rusk, addressing the American Legion Auxiliary, composed of wives of American legionnaires, warned on August 31 that Americans must not "suppose that if we turn our backs somebody else will act" to prevent communist aggression in Asia.

He emphasized, too, that a paramount purpose of the Johnson administration's foreign policy was "to secure

the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity. "If a hard choice has to be made between the liberty and peace, we shall choose liberty just as we have done in the past," the Secretary said.

Mr. Rusk said he was "quite aware" that Chinese communist party leader Mao Tse-Tung "is not Hitler" and that Peking's Defense Minister Lin Biao's September 1965 article "is not

Mela Kempf." "But the differences," he cautioned, "should not be allowed to conceal the heart of the matter."

The Secretary of State said it would be "a tragedy for mankind if we were to forget the most important lessons leading up to World War Two, for we are not going to have the chance to draw the lessons from World War Three."

Back-to-the-Farm . . . Mr. Rusk reiterated that the U.S. presence in South Vietnam is to repel North Vietnamese aggression and to assure the South Vietnamese people the choice of their own future. "When those objectives have been achieved, then we will withdraw," he said.

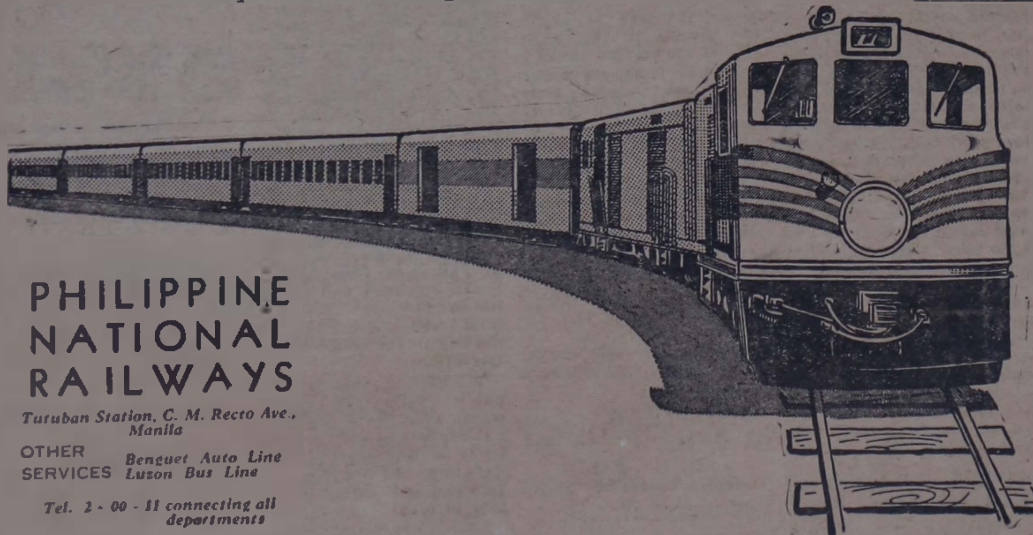
