

# NEWS OF THE WEEK

PLYMOUTH VT. August 22.—President Coolidge regards the final settlement of the reparations problem the paramount world problem until the Dawes plan is finally put into operation.

AUGUSTA, ME., August 23.—Charles G. Dawes, Republican candidate for vice-president, speaking here today declared that he was opposed to the Ku Klux Klan, although he realized that many had become members of the order in the interest of law and order.

PARIS, August 23.—The Dawes plan became the but of French international politics this afternoon in the Chamber of Deputies when Charles Reidel, minister of the liberated regions under Premier Poincare claimed for the former government the entire credit for making possible the work of the experts.

BERLIN, August 20.—Former Crown-Prince, George of Saxony is to embrace the priesthood at Trepnitz, to expiate the sin of his mother.

PEKIN, August 25.—President Tsao yesterday sent a messenger to general Wi Pei Fu, suggesting that he prevent the impending Chekiang-Kiangsu war.

Wi Pei Fu today replied that the Tuchun of Chekiang must be shown his place.

SEAGIRT, N. J. August 22.—John W. Davis, Democratic nominee for president in an address heto tonight made it clear that his opinion was that President Coolidge's acceptance address failed to meet the issue of corruption in public office.

TOKIO August 22.—A spare airplane for Major Fedro Zanni, Argentine aviator, has arrived at Kobe from London and is being prepared for reshipment to Hanoi, Indo-China, from whence he will continue his flight.

GENEVA, August 25.—The League of Nations today received President L. Quezon and Senator Sergio Osmeña

of the Philippine Islands and others interesting themselves in the league are expected.

WASHINGTON, August 25.—Permission was granted today to broadcast "Philippine National Night", from the radio station on the arrival here from Europe of Senate President Manuel Quezon and Senator Sergio Osmeña about September 12. The program will include native music and talks by Senators Quezon and Osmeña on the traditions, aspirations and achievements of the Philippino people.

SHANGHAI, August 27.—With the arrival armies of Kiabgsu and Chekiang provinces only 18 miles apart and with martial law prevailing throughout the entire district surrounding Shanghai, the scenes are all set here for the beginning of actual fighting tomorrow, unless something happens at the last minute to stop the outbreak.

BRUSSELS, August 25.—Dortmund will be evacuated by the Belgians early in September says "Libre Belgique", and the customs post of Lippeswell will be abandoned at the same time.

BERLIN, August 23.—Chancellor Marx today warned the Reichtag that the London conference gave Germany a chance which is not likely to be renewed.

BERLIN, August 27.—Is was officially announced today that the German government will sign the London agreement whether the Reichstag approves or disapproves it. It is announced that the Reichstag will be dissolve if it rejects the pact.

SHANGHAI, August 27.—Shun Pao, leading vernacular newspaper, reports the actual outbreak of warfare between the forces at Quinsan near here on the Shanghai Nanking Railway.

TOKIO, August 27.—The army reorganization program received its

final shaping today at the hands of the council of marshals, generals and war councillors. The scheme is to abolish four divisions and other minor units which will result in an annual saving of 18,000,000 yen, which will be spent in the establishment of twelve air squadrons, tank corps, anti-aircraft units, transpor schools, chemical warfare and reseach schools.

LONDON, August, 28.—A dispatch from Athens today says a series of explosions started at midnight in a large gunpoeder depot near the arsenal and spread to the neighboring munitions depots. A large number of casualties was reported.

SHANGHAI, August 30.—The strong move launched here last friday by powerful Chinese commercial interest to induce the American, British, French and Japanese chambers of commerce to appoint a committee of mediation in the threatening was between Chekiang and Kiangsu provinces is believed a failure today.

PARIS, August 30.—France will order the evacuation of Dortmund tomorrow executing Premier Herriot's agreement that evacuation would begin in the day after the signing of the London conference.

NEW-YORK, August 28.—The American Telephone and Telegraph Company announced today that colored pictures were transmitted between Chicago and New York by telegraph. The picture was placed in the sending machine in Chicago and was reproduced here in less than an hour in its original colors.

MANILA, August 30.—Senate President Quezon and Senator Osmeña, who are now in Europe, as observers of the League of Nations and Inter-Parliamentary Union proceedings, are expected to return to the islands shortly before the close of the legislative sessions, it is stated in political circles.
