

La supremacía en el aire es muy esencial, dice el Almirante Yonai

(Especial a LA VANGUARDIA)
Tokio, 7 de septiembre.—Haciendo un resumen de los acontecimientos de la guerra naval desde que se sometieron los informes en la pasada sesión de la Dieta, el Ministro de la Armada, Almirante Mitsumasa Yonai ha recalado la importancia de la supremacía aérea para aplastar al enemigo.

Las fuerzas japonesas en Omyasima y en la isla de Tinian están ofreciendo una tenaz resistencia contra las fuerzas enemigas invasoras que habían desembarcado en dichas islas después de la ocupación de la isla de Saipan. Igualmente en el área de Nueva Guinea, las fuerzas Imperiales están parando el avance del enemigo mediante el empleo de las fuerzas aéreas, según se ha revelado.

En estas operaciones, el Ministro de Marina declaró, el Ejército y la Marina así como las fuerzas aéreas están utilizando toda su energía combatiente para infligir fuertes golpes al enemigo.

El Ministro de Guerra da cuenta de la situación: graves bajas enemigas

Tokio, 7 de septiembre.—Revisando los recientes desenvolvimientos de la guerra en todos los frentes, el Ministro de Guerra Gen Sugiyama, hablando hoy ante la Dieta, expresó la firme determinación de las fuerzas Imperiales de aplastar al enemigo. Cito casos de la inquebrantable determinación de los oficiales y soldados en los diferentes frentes de guerra.

El Ministro de Guerra dijo en parte:

"Estais subsientemente conscientes de la situación de la guerra desde el año pasado por medio de los comunicados expedidos por los Cuarteles Generales Imperiales. Mientras una enconada lucha esta desarrollándose con mayor intensidad en el Pacífico y en el continente, deseo explicar los últimos desenvolvimientos.

"En el área del centro del Pacífico acerca de la cual la Marina sometera detalles más tarde, deseo mencionar que las fuerzas Imperiales en Nueva Bretaña y Bougainville están sosteniendo sus posiciones e infligiendo contundentes golpes al enemigo. Rabaul y sus cercanías sigue consolidado."

El Ministro de Guerra tocando luego la cuestión de la heroica muerte de los oficiales y soldados de las fuerzas Imperiales y de los civiles en la isla de Saipan, recalco el espíritu que inspiraba su inquebrantable determinación de sacrificar sus vidas por la nación.

Las pérdidas enemigas en Saipan, Tinian y Omyasima llegaron a 30,000 según los comunicados americanos, mientras que igualmente cuantiosas bajas fueron infligidas a los invasores en el área de Atape, Nueva Guinea, desde Julio pasado. La lucha en las áreas del sur continúa con furia
