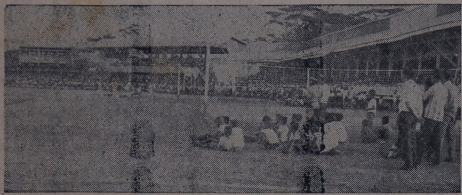

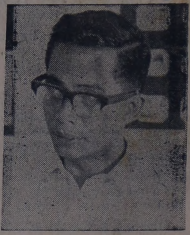

### 3 Young Girls Missing Kickback Racket Denied; "Ridiculous" say Contractors



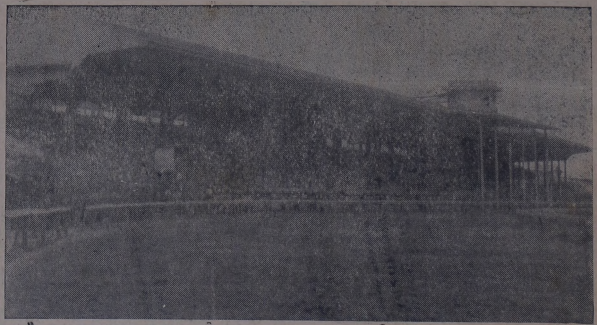
Three young girls, all students in the J. Panganiban high school J. Panganiban, Cam. Norte, were reported to the Bicol Star as missing from their homes since Jan. 3, 1968 by Mrs. Rufina Bermudez Vda. de Obias, mother of Gonzon Obias, 15, one of the missing girls. The other two companions when they disappeared, are Elena Istabello, 10 and Dolores Obias, 13. The two girls appearing in the above picture are Miss Obias and Miss Istabello.

"This is ridiculous," This was the general reaction of contractors when confronted last week by Dr. Jose P. Cledera, project director of the Interscholastic site, on the alleged kickback racket at the project.

## SPEAKOUT BICOLANDIA

Mr. X, Manila businessman, was reportedly awarded 300,000 hectares of choice timberlands in Mindano because he is putting up an integrated pulp and paper mill. Another Malacanang favorite went to the Palace and wanted 50,000 hectares of rich timberland as his price for big financial support in the 1965 elections.

"But there are no more vacant forest concessions," Malacanang said. "Yes there are," Businessman No. 2 said. "Where."

Mr. X Businessman has a 300,000 hectares concession. Actually his area is over 500,000 hectares. Threaten him with a perimeter survey. "We will see," Businessman No. 2 said.

Businessman No. 2 got his 50,000 hectares. Mr. X grumbled but what can he do. He would not risk a perimeter survey.

These two businessmen are mestizos. I did not say Chinese or Turkish. This just proves to you how corrupt our people can be -- with our patrimony.

Everybody loves local autonomy, including President Marcos. But Malacanang makes a farce of decentralization. For instance, the law authorizes 10 to 15% automatic retention by the provinces and cities of BIR collections. That would be good if the municipal and provincial and city treasurer collect the internal revenue taxes so that the treasurers automatically deduct the share of the local government.

The problem is municipal BIR collectors turn over their collections to the provincial and regional BIR collectors who in turn remit the funds direct to Manila. Naturally the governors and the mayors have to kneel and beg from Malacanang of BIR shares that are legally theirs.

But hear Marcos speak about local autonomy. He is the founder and angel of decentralization Hic.

Ask your governor and mayor if they got their BIR share. If they were given a morsel today, they were for those three quarters ago.

BIR friends leaked out the information that collections last year is 30% lower than expected. So is the customs. No wonder BIR shares of local governments are not remitted; salaries are delayed; retirement payments suspended; contracts not paid; trust funds abused; mayor projects stopped and public projects grounded to a halt.

Foreign banks must be miserly Jews. They would not lend us no more.

What did Marcos do to straighten the mess he brought us. He told Uncle Sam, "Give us loans and aid or I go to Moscow." Sukarno style.

Some friends have asked me why I started a syndicated column all over Bicolandia. Am I running for the senate? Of course not, I have had enough running. This time I would like to sit or fly.

An American newspaperman friend stopped four hours in Manila and asked me if it is true there are two forms of governments in Central Luzon. I said, "Yes, the Invisible and the Incurable."

Would the Parks and Wildlife conduct a perimeter survey of Bulusan Lake National Park? There were reports that somebody grabbed hundreds of hectares from the park. He had them tilled too.

It would also be good if the office would send patrols. There are 17 new Kaingins in the virgin forest reservations. Choice lumber have been systematically cut from the park. While Marcos talk about conservation.

Ambassador Williams made a flying visit to Sorsogon recently. He visited only one project -- the Sorsogon dairy plant. Four months ago, British Ambassador Addie went to Sorsogon and visited only the Sorsogon dairy project. To think that when I was governor some Nacionalistas have been poking fun at that project. Hope they do not abandon that now.

## Private Education Fund Established by Six Million Dollar U.S. Treasury Disbursement

A trust fund for private education in the Philippines will shortly be established following the disbursement by the U.S. Treasury of \$6.154 million. The disbursement was made Dec. 3.

The fund, created out of the \$23 million Special Fund for Education by agreement between the Philippine and U.S. governments, will be under the trusteeship of a special Committee for Assistance to Private Education. Earnings from the fund will be utilized to

provide assistance to private education in the Philippines.

The committee administering the fund is composed of the following: the Secretary of Education, chairman, a representative of the National Economic Council, and representatives of three private education associations -- the Philippine Association of Colleges & Universities, the Catholic Educational Association of the Philippines, and the Association of Christian Schools & Colleges.

## U.S. Ready to Settle Disputes Honorably: Clifford

Washington -- Defense Secretary Clifford says the U.S. is ready to join "all men of reason" in settling international disputes with honor.

In a Christmas message to Americans in the armed services Dec. 17 Mr. Clifford said it is a season "of peace and joy and new beginnings."

While no man can bring about peace, the Defense official said, "all men of reason and rectitude -- whatever their differences -- can reap the greatest reward of all by settling their disputes with honor and honesty."

"The U.S. remains at the ready to do just that," Mr. Clifford said.

## U.S. Warns Hanoi of Consequences if Attack on Cities Renewed

Washington -- The U.S. warned North Vietnam Dec. 19 that "serious consequences" would follow any resumption of communist attacks on South Vietnam's major cities.

Robert J. McCloskey, State Department spokesman, told newsmen the U.S. warning was based on intelligence information and was conveyed by Cyrus Vance, number two U.S. delegate at the Paris talks, to this North Vietnamese counterpart, Colonel Ha Van Lau.

## Pictorial Directory of Local Govt. Officials Coming Out Soon

The Biographical Researchers Society of the Philippines (BRSP) will publish early this year THE PICTORIAL DIRECTORY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS -- from provincial governors down to barrio councilmen -- Prof. Wilfredo P. Valenzuela, BRSP chairman, announced.

The first of its kind in the Philippines, the Directory will be published in a souvenir book form as a sequel edition of Volume 4, 1969 edition, of KNOW THEM, an approved book of biographies of contemporary Filipino leaders.

The Directory will be printed in offset process, containing about 300 pages, measuring 7 by 10 inches, with a beautifully-designed and colored cover.

Assistant Executive Secretary Flores A. Bayot of the Local Government and Civil Affairs Office of Malacanang will write the Introduction.

We are forgetting probably about those much needed "callesiones" for our fire trucks.

Secretary Antonio V. Raquiza will soon step out of the Marcos cabinet. Mr. Raquiza, reports claim is a victim of intrigues from the "Imelda boys." Raquiza's ouster may turn out to be the most costly error of the Marcos administration. The man is admitted in the Marcos camp to be the President's most loyal man, and yet he had to go. Embittered, his loyalty could be converted into violent hate. He can wreck the President's reelection plan. The man knows many things.

Six months ago, President Marcos was believed to be unbeatable. Today, I am beginning to notice that the President's popularity is going down. I blame it on the quarrels within his circle. Cliques are actively fighting among themselves. If the President does not look out, he will be a goner before he knows it. The Liberals will only give the finishing blow when the time comes.

## Dr. Jose P. Rizal and Bicol Martyrs Honored in Naga City Dec. 30, Jan. 4

Naga City in a simple manner but with profundity celebrated the 72nd anniversary of the execution of Dr. Jose Protacio Rizal last December 30 and the Fifteen Bicol Martyrs last January 4. Dr. Rizal was executed Dec. 30, 1896 in Bagumbayan, one of the 15 Bicol martyrs. 11 were also executed in Bagumbayan (now Luneta) field, Manila on January 4, 1898, namely, Fr. Inocencio Herrera, Fr. Gabriel Prieto, Fr. Severino Diaz, Manuel Abella, Domingo Abella, Carmelo Jacob, Tomas Prieto, Florentino Lerma, Mascarito Valentin, Cornelia Mercado and Mariano Magsajero. The other four of the Bicol martyrs died in prison or in exile in Fernando Po, Africa, namely, Leon Hernandez, Ramon Abella, Mariano Arana

U.S. Asks Humane Treatment of Prisoners in North Vietnam

United Nations - The U.S. has called on North Vietnam to "live up to the basic humanitarian standards of the Geneva convention in its treatment of prisoners of war."

U.S. delegate Mrs. Jean Picker made the appeal Dec. 10 in the General Assembly's Humanitarian Committee which is considering human rights in armed conflicts.

Mrs. Picker also expressed the hope that the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) "on another impartial intermediary will be permitted to visit American detainees in North Korea."

Hanoi Agrees to Let Captured Pilot Get Christmas Mail

Washington - For the first time in the Vietnam war, North Vietnam will permit captured U.S. pilots to receive Christmas packages and postcards from their families.

This was disclosed Dec. 12 by State Department spokesman Robert J. McCloskey, who said the U.S. was "pleased."

"On behalf of the captured pilots they will be able to receive these postcards and packages," Mr. McCloskey told a news briefing.

The spokesman said a communication was received in Paris the same day by W. Averell Harriman, head of the U.S. delegation to the peace talks, from his North Vietnamese counterpart, Xuan Thuy, stating that the Christmas gifts could be forwarded through regular mail channels directly to Hanoi.

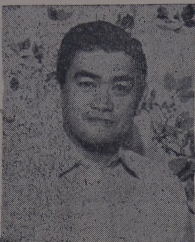

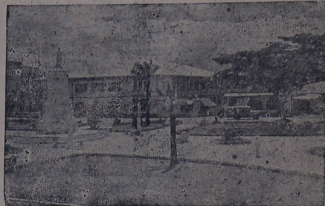

His untimely death saved him from facing a fate his predecessors before him, and his successors after him, had to undergo, merited or unmerited.

Democracy has many acute defects but it is the best mechanism to secure a consensus of the people's will. We can improve it, not by emasculating it, but by educating the human elements. It is this that is troubling democracy and not democracy itself.

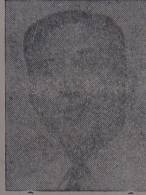

Editorial

Rural Uplift Means Material Help

Sometime ago a Vatican Order to its priests and hierarchies resounded throughout the world because of its sensational novelty in enjoining them to take active participation in the universal program of governments for rural improve- ment.

The Order was received more enthusiastically in the Philippines where the Catholic Church is said to be more stable and richer than the government.

What was therefore, expected was positive action from them and not from their parishioners that would spell material interpretation; not just plan loud and bombastic talking about what is meant by rural improvement.

The holding of Rural Congress for the purpose of indorsing the idea to the parishioners is certainly not implementation by them to whom the Order was directed. Catholic Associations and Mandated Orders are not representatives of the Catholic Church because they receive no share from its income. Therefore, implementation of the Vatican Order must be carried out by the priests and hierarchies because they alone are the representatives of the Catholic Church; not the parishioners. It means for them to go to the rural areas to find out for themselves what are needed by the poor for the improvement of their lot.

It means for them to walk behind the dark alley of the poor to find out what the Catholic Church can do for the improvement of their living condition.

Most important to find out is what material help did the Catholic Church give to the fire victims of Ragay and Pasacao who lost not only their homes but every precious personal belongings they had. If the Catholic Church did not give anything to them at the time when they were very badly in need of help, how could it be possible for the Church to be truly concerned of an objective which entails more sacrifices and money for implementation?

Jesus interpreted to the world in positive action as the meaning of rural uplift. He traveled far and wide, even by night, to minister help to the needy. He dia it Himself at the head of His disciples. He lived, served a n d suffered with them. Do we see even a semblance of similarity between His life of Catholic priests and hierarchies? A. G. D.

Ninoy Aquino, I grant, spoke in all sincerity at the Bicol Rural congress but he cannot be blamed if one thinks that his suggestion that President Marcos be reelected by a political consensus of the leaders does not sound so all in this country of ours, the way we take our politics, any suggestion like that coming from the Opposition is either uttered with tongue in cheek or is madness pure and simple-political madness, that is, the worst madness ever.

X X X

Senator Aquino was exhausted in his explanations, yes, and he used all the gum of his persuasive eloquence and logic, but he himself was aware that he was suggesting a impossibility in the political milieu of the Philippines. First, he said it was just the idea of his. His party has not as yet heard of his brainchild. Then, he added that it was a notion so venereal, so drastic, so out-of-this-world, he felt the impression it would be a bitterly contested notion.

The idea in itself was that unusual and a hard nut to crack; the implementation was not a harder one to achieve. It would seem that only the Presidency would be the object of a consensus; as to the rest of the political realities, the same merry-go-round. And what is the good of it? He was saying of some 600 million pesos, the cost of a presidential election.

The question naturally arises: What of the democratic substance which will be reduced to the decision of a handful of political pundits of both major parties? In other words, it is a veritable betrayal of a fundamental democratic principle. A price tag has been placed on it; for 600 million we will become robots of a handful of politicians. This is a deprivation of suffrage, but the Senator did not spell it that way. To him it was a saving of 600 million which, in his plan, would better be spent in the economic advancement of the country.

The Senator has forgotten that the solution of an expensive presidential election is to force it to be less expensive. This is the manly solution and not the scrapping of our young democracy. We are not going to solve our political ills by running away from them. We should solve them by facing up to them and purge them as drastically as possible.

X X X

That purging should consist in cleansing it of its abuses, chiefly the abuse of money by the corrupt politicians. There are beginnings along this line but we should do more. The Congress should enact laws with teeth in them making it criminal to use money to spend recklessly in his electoral campaigns, to

buy one's way into a fraudulent elective by bribing electoral employees and officials. And the President should sign them into laws real presto.

X X X

What prompted Senator Aquino to make this suggestion? Gratitude because it was a Nationalistic vote that cleared the way for him to the Senate? One cannot help suspecting that Senator Gazcon, the deciding vote, was instructed by the President to cast such a vote. Ninoy Aquino was less deadly in the Senate than let loose ranging all over the country as a martyr, a victim of Presidential persecution. Shades of 'Iguahituli'. Is Ninoy's Presidential political consensus really a vote to be far-fetched if one considers the beneficiary as sure reelectionist. A very grateful man this Aquino, one should say. The trouble with all this is that it makes a picture not of Ninoy at all. And this I say because he is not known as a man of sudden changes, even if the motivation is one of gratitude for a good turn done.

One other fallacy of the Senator regarding reelectionist President is being perforce a good one due to his inability to succeed himself once again according to our Constitution, is the unpredictability of the human nature. And, also, because of the cogency of his becoming just a picture other than a good one, on the assumption it will be his last chance, anyway. If we must consider that he would not think of any other consideration except the good of his people, there being no reelection to prepare for what would prevent us to view him as a man in his last fling in the enjoyment of Presidential powers and privileges? A man on the eve of his marriage usually has his Saturnalia, meaning that last chance to enjoy the fruits of bachelorhood. Similarly, a President would be likely to indulge. The better reason in this case because the Presidency is by far an opportunity for greater benefits.

X X X

It is the height of disingenousness to predicate one's speculations on the better aspect of human nature, for very few can resist the lure of power at its best. By this principle, it is dangerous to predicate a better human behavior on the certainty it is the last enjoyment of a given set of 'goodies'. For every year of the Presidency, with a previous enjoyment of its appurtenant realities, is a temptation hard to resist in the average human. One must bone in mind that it requires superhuman virtues of which very few - if at all - do have. And, even if we have that rare case in Pres. Marcos, what will prevent his utter sellings from using his name to promote their own selfish interests?

Pinaglaoman na an P44,000 na halagang proyeto matapos sa laog nin limang semana.

### Incentivo Para sa Capitalistas

An gobierno provincial nagbigawang magdan an mga negociantes asin darakul na capitalistas. Kun an mga recursos naturales patin yaman nin kabukidman manyong saka gamiton, ini huli kan atraccion na hinatoo ni Gobernador. Sa sarong marhay na kaisipan (na nakasagay nin pagtuyaw kan mga tawong mga bakong marhay na motivo) nagkaya nin an junta provincial na magpasar nin resolusion na magbukas nin sugar central o azucarras an Southern Luzon Sugar Central, Inc., digdi sa satuya. Sosog sa mga oficiales kan companiang naonabihan, an proyeto magkakaigo nin 40,000 hectarea na daing pakinabang na daga asin mampaleng nin umabot-kumulang 10,000 katawo na maatop nin kulang-kulang P125 M taon-taon en forma de ingreso sa kabayan kan gobierno local. Kangkalangalang lang na sabihon na igwa nin mga tawong nangyugoy na itao an pamahala kan proyeto sa Bicol Development Company (BIDECO) minsan pa ngani igwa nin pagtuyaw sa Presidente Marcos na ipahonod sa agencias privadas an pagpogol kan siring na proyeto "huli kan labi-labiing ineficiencia o pagkukulang nin kakapahan kan mga corparaciones nin presyo" na pagpakalaw kan arog kainang dakulang proyeto.

### Manpower Training

An pagkukulang nin empleyo iyo pa giraray an dakulog koolangan sa proyeto na kaipuhan nagdagdang hamangan kan presenteng nagpopogol kan reinda kan gobierno provincial. An adminis-

tracion naghihimoyawot na gayong matawan nin sulucion an bagay na ini. An Manpower Training ipinagpapalago ngonyan sa provincia na nagtotokeo nin mga vocational courses o mga practicong haralipot na curso para sa mga mayong hanapuhay. Si Gobernador minatubod na dai nangad magkakaigwa nin pagkukulang nin empleyo kun igwa nin dakul na tataso asin cualificadong magtrabaho. Siring man tangiang maseguro na an mga matapos sa cursoong Manpower Training matawan nin hanapuhay, sinda inatawan nin mga garanton o kasangkapan sa trabahong nanondan ninda. Sarong oficina an ngonyan pigbababangang togdason na iyo an mamamahala kan pagtuo nin trabajo duman sa mga nagkapatapos kan curso.

### Tourism

Ngonyan pa sana nagkakaigwa nin tolotol na estudio o pagdadala sa pagkakarhay kan mga turista potential maggagayon na pangitona sa provincia. Si ginibong survey kan RPD nagpapatotoo na an lalawigan igwa nin damot o bilakid na tanawon asin maoongmang pangitona na huli ta dai tinatawan kan maningong importancia, pinagimangliman lang an bagay na ini na puending maikailok sa mga turistat na magdidit satuya. mga datos asin lista kan mga tourist attraction o mayayon na pangitona sa pagkawawot sa paggibo nin tolotol-na accion sa ano man na bagay na karahayan kan provincia.
