COPRA AND ITS PRODUCTS

As far as copra, coconut oil and copra cake are concerned, February was a month of almost complete stagnation. This was largely due, of course, to the pending excise tax legislation in the United States congress, resulting in paralyzation of American business with the consequential depression of other markets indirectly affected. During the course of the month, the House of Representatives passed this measure over a great storm of protests and the bill is now in the hands of the Senate for action. Indications are that the bill will be killed or modified in the Senate, but this can only be anticipated if constant pressure is brought to bear.

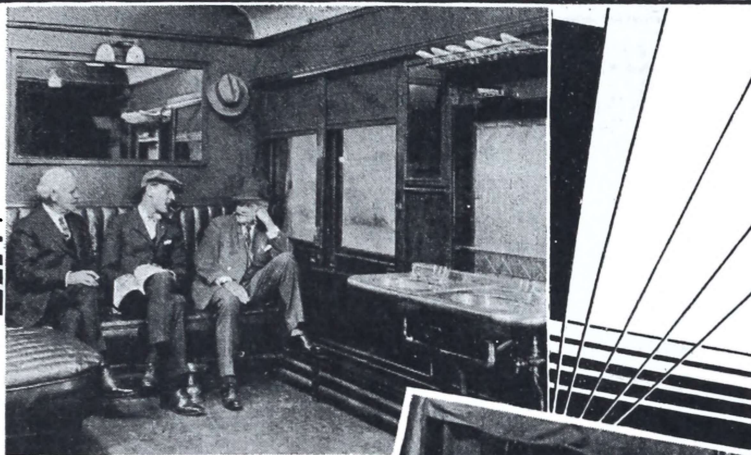
COPRA: Copra was weak all month long starting at ₱4.00 per 100 kilos Resecada, in spite of only moderate arrivals, quotations gradually declined to ₱3.60, the lowest figure on record. Oil manufacturers, if they bought at all, were buying on speculation, and the only real business done was to cover positions of a few coast mills and to look after a steadily declining London market. Pacific coast prices ranged down from 1.30 cents to 1.25 cents, with some business passing at 1.27-1/2 cents. London was erratic at between £7.7.6 f.m.m. to £7.2.6 f.m.m. with corresponding premiums for Sundried. Some sales were made, but not a great deal of business was done.

Shipments, on the other hand, were normal, being based mostly on previous contracts.
