

# RCA Probe Ordered By President Marcos

Pres. Marcos today ordered the relief of personnel of the Rice and Corn Administration found to have been involved in any irregularities, including electioneering for any political party in the last elections.

"You are directed to screen the officials and employees of the Rice and Corn Administration and weed out all those involved in irregularities, the President told Colonel Osmundo Mondonedo, RCA administrator.

The President called for this further action in addition to the charges already filed by the RCA against employees found to have illegally profited from fictitious purchases of cereal estimated in the amount of P30 million.

The President told Mondonedo that Malacañang has been furnished with reports of the investigations conducted to ascertain the culpability of RCA personnel. The reports indicated that many employees were found to be liable to prosecution or dismissal from the agency.

The order to weed out corrupt employees in the rice and corn firm was issued by the President after persistent representations from various sectors, including senators and congressmen, for the prosecution of officials and employees in the cereal agency who were involved in irregularities in the distribution of rice and corn causing huge losses to the government.

The President required immediate compliance with the order and asked for a report on the action taken by Mondonedo within 30 days of receipt of his order.

In the meantime, the President set a minimum charge of ten centavos for the transmission of complaints and grievances of citizens to the Land Authority governor, in connection with the implementation of the land reform program.

The minimum charge of ten centavos will apply to wires or other telegraphic services sent through or rendered by the Bureau of Telecommunications.

The President said that because of the importance of the land reform program, and due to the "manifold problems" that may be encountered in implementing it, it was essential for the proper authorities to pay the closest attention to any complaints or grievances from the public.

The benefits from the program, he added, can only be fully realized if the government sector diligently attended to all the complexities involved.

He asked the authorities concerned to make it easy for these complaints to reach their desk.

### NOTICE OF PETITION FOR PHILIPPINE CITIZENSHIP

To the Solicitor General, Manila, to Mr. Jaime Bichara, Naga City, to Atty. Borja & Naval, counsels for the petitioner, Naga City and to all whom it may concern:

WHEREAS a petition for Philippine citizenship pursuant to the provisions of Commonwealth Act No. 473, as amended, has been filed in this Court by JAIME BICHARA who alleges that his full name is JAIME BICHARA; that his present and previous or former place of residence is at Naga City, Philippines; that his occupation is that of a businessman, being the operator of the "JAMES THEATRE" at Calabanga, Camarines Sur, Philippines from which he derives an average annual income of P3,500.00, more or less, and that he is also the manager of the theatre owned by the BICHARA & SONS firm which he derives an annual compensation of P6,000.00; that aside from the above mentioned source of income, he is one of the co-owners of the estate left by his deceased father Victor Bichara and that his share in the estate, consisting mostly of real properties, is P7,000.00, more or less; that he was born on September 21, 1926 at Naga, Camarines Sur, new Naga City, Philippines and he is at present a citizen or subject of Lebanon, under whose laws Filipinos may become citizens or subject thereof; that he is married and that his wife's name is Nimia Midel, a Filipino citizen by birth who was born on November 29, 1939; that he has two children and the names; dates and places of their residence are as follows:

1. Joan Bichara - born on April 9, 1964 at Naga City and
2. Joseph Bichara - born on August 4, 1965 at Naga City, all of whom are residing at Naga City with him; that when his afore-named children reach school age, he will enroll them in a public school duly recognized by the government, where Philippine history, government and civics are taught as part of the school curriculum, and whose enrollment shall be open to anyone, irrespective of race nationality or religion; that he has resided continuously in the Philippines for more than 40 years already immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit: since 1926, the year of his birth, and in the City of Naga, for a term of more than one year immediately preceding the date of the petition, to wit: since 1928 that he has not heretofore made any petition for citizenship to any court; that he is exempted from the filing a declaration of intention because he was born in the
