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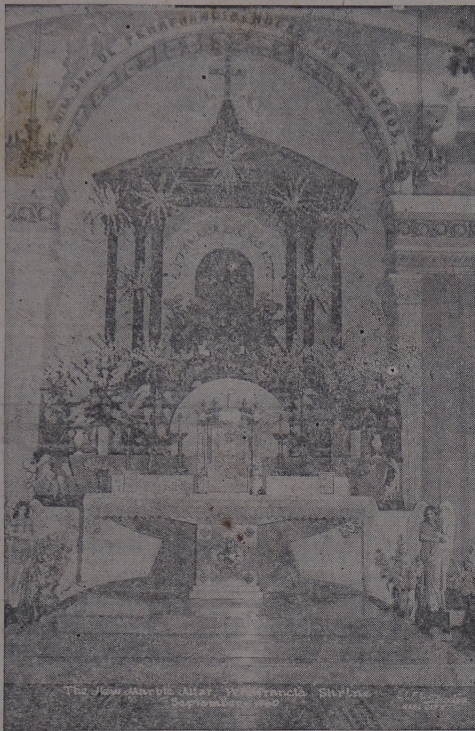
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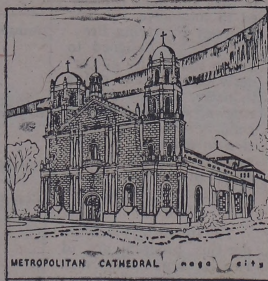

The new Shrine of the Penafrañcia Shrine



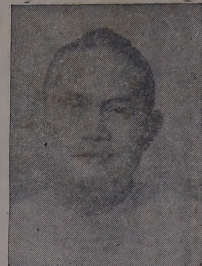

American Responsibility To The Free World

(Nineteenth of a series)

The Vietnamese Resistance Continued—The rallying point in the stated American involvement in South Vietnam is the belief that U.S. supremacy in the land and air war which has gone to the point of escalation is the final pro quo that military victory in eight Gen. Wesley Westmoreland, the American allied commander in South Vietnam has made the assurance that to meet the primary of this requirement there should be a comparative increase in U.S. manpower deployment to an aggregate of 1,000,000 soldiers that could handle effectively the recurrent problems of North Vietnamese infiltration passing the notorious Ho Chi Minh trail onto South Vietnam.

The situation to be rightly appraised would mean that in infiltration is going on steadily despite the U.S. bombing runs which Defense Secretary Robert McNamara definitively answered his critics that the bombings is intended solely to reduce the mode of infiltration of North Vietnamese military manpower and equipment. Today the American manpower status in South Vietnam is placed at 55,000 soldiers thus oversteering the half-million mark. With the request of Gen. Westmoreland for more fighting units—the U.S. is expected to bolster its fighting men to 3/4 million or 750,000 by the middle of 1968. Thus far it is safe to say that the U.S. pragmatic policy is to live in an indefinite do-or-die until such time as American strategy to devise better means or deploy better weapons of war as will compel and break the backbone of North Vietnamese to the negotiating table.

Vo Nguyen Giap—North Vietnamese Tactician In the preceding installment the writer discussed and traced the movement of the Vietnamese resistance culminating in the ignominious defeat of the French forces at Dien Bien in 1954. Nominally the Indo-Chinese war was so costly to the French trying the main bulk of the French armed forces to the Asiatic mainland for over a decade. The defeat of the French forces automatically reduced France's second rate power.

In the travesty of the stiffened and continuing North Vietnamese resistance from 1944 to the end of the Indo-Chinese war in 1954 and from the year 1954 when the Americans took the cudgel for the defense of freedom in Southeast Asia—one man aside from President Ho Chi Minh of the North Vietnamese Republic is to be reckoned with and who consistently keeps the communist forces feverishly fighting without let up for their armor patrie. The man is Gen. Vo Nguyen Giap—the agile North Vietnamese Hanoi Professor turned military man. As Secretary of Defense of the North Vietnamese communist forces he has indoctrinated the wily art of guerrilla warfare to the point that Nguyen Giap personality has become the symbol of the continuing Vietnam dialogue and ever continuing stiffened resistance. From the year 1954 when the Kingdom of Annam (Indo China) was partitioned as a result of the Geneva Conference, the United States has practically stayed in South Vietnam for 13 years in a straight row without yet knowing for sure when the undeclared war would end.

A knotty problem solved by wisdom

For the last six months, Mr. Napoleon Valiente brought a knotty problem to the Nationalists of Camaligan by assuring all and sundry that he was a candidate for Mayor whether official or not. This is the way he made the people believe in all six months of intensive campaign.

But because convention is mandatory following the Rules of the party, Mr. Valiente was earnestly supplicated by the local chairman to enter the municipal convention which was set for yesterday, Sept. 12, not even if only to prove that he was a loyal Nationalista. This supplication was offered to him for several times but his answer was always firmly on the negative.

One day before the convention, Mandina Cladera, the NP official candidate for governor, always intellectually resourceful as he is, called Mr. Valiente to a conference for the purpose of making him see the side of the question that he (Mr. Valiente) could not clearly see.

Watch now the beauty of thought that was expressed in simple terms to Mr. Valiente.

"I called for you this morning to tell you that the convention of our party will be held in your town tomorrow evening. I was reliably informed that, you will not, by any consideration, enter the convention. That will leave Mr. Loriga the lone candidate for Mayor and because he has no opponent his election in the convention is already a matter of fact. You finally a candidate for Mayor whether official or not. In that case, there will be two of you for the Nationalista to choose against only one for the Liberals. How can both of you hope to win under such adverse position? Two against one, that certainly is a hopeless fight. Considering further that the odds are in favor of the Liberal candidate, one, because he is the incumbent and two, because he has money, I honestly believe that both of you are as good as beaten from the beginning to the end.

"But one decides to be a candidate because he wants to win and not to be defeated. This should be your point of view. Between you and Loriga, you are my choice but I'll the people in Camaligan with whom I had personally contacted for general opinion, are unanimous that Loriga can tick the present Mayor. It is for this reason and for the sake of public interest that I am now asking you to be the team mate of Loriga for the position of Vice-Mayor instead of Mayor. It is my opinion that both of you will be jarringly unbeatable.

"Now, before we end, my last question is: Are you agreeable to my proposition? Convicted that there was wisdom in the sermon of Cladera, Valiente's reply was a curt "Yes".

The conference was ended. The municipal convention was held as scheduled, unanimously voted Loriga for Mayor and Valiente for Vice Mayor after which and in accordance thereto were proclaimed by Atty. Abonal, the party's official candidate for Board Member amidst cheers and ovations and the congratulations of everyone that was present."

My reason of putting this event into writing is primarily because of my personal admiration for the beauty and splendor of Cladera's imagination in solving problems that are considered knotty by the ordinary minds.

FM Orders Relief Of Erring PC Men

President Marcos imposed a more rigid discipline on PC officers and men as he ordered their immediate and prosecution of those relief taking part or allow any form of terrorism or immoral practices, particularly this election year.

The President instructed Defense Secretary Ernesto Mata to appeal to opposition leaders to help secure evidence against erring PC personnel.

He said that opposition leaders should be encouraged to accompany "if they so desire government investigators probing PC personnel linked to any irregularity or acts of terrorism."

The President's order covers all PC troops deployed throughout the country, particularly those in Ilocos Sur.

The President further required Secretary Mata to submit his initial report on the implementation of his order within 15 days and every 15 days thereafter until November 14, or election day.

The immediate arrest and deportation of a Chinese national was recently ordered by President Marcos for misrepresentation.

The Chief Executive ordered the deportation of **William Lee**, whose known address is 855 San Andres, Malate, Manila, who was identified as the son of Severino By Li and Yang Yau Ho, both Chinese, mispresented himself as an American citizen. By such device, he was able to convince a Filipino to accept his proposal of marriage, with the wedding subsequently set for September, 1963. But then Lee's duplicity was discovered, and the marriage was canceled. The parents of the would be bride brought suit, seeking Lee's expulsion from the country.

After duly hearing the case, the Deportation Board found that Lee "made false statements as to his identity, citizenship, date of birth and residence," if so applied false information to the application for a marriage license that he filed.

Lee admitted having misrepresented himself "for the purpose of winning complainant's love and affection." The Board recommended Lee's expulsion and "thereafter, exclude him from the Philippines."

**UN Convention On
Narcotic Drug Confirmed**

The United Nations General Assembly Convention providing for continuous international cooperation and control of narcotic drugs was confirmed recently by President Marcos.

Narcotic drugs, under this Convention, will be limit d only to medical and scientific applications. It replaces existing treaties on such drugs. The President, in confirming the UN Convention on narcotic drugs, underscored the concern of his administration for the growing narcotic menace in the country, especially among students and other youths.

Recently, he issued a proclamation imposing rigid curbs on a number of drugs which he defined as habit-forming. The list of 52 drugs covered by the proclamation was transmitted to the Philippines by the World Health Organization.

The strict control imposed by the President is also in accord with the provisions of the Narcotic Drug Law. Its purpose is to prevent or minimize use of addiction-forming or addiction sustaining drugs and to combat the traffic in the drive against drug addiction.

In a parallel move to strengthen the law, a move which has a direct bearing on the administration's peace and order drive, the President has recently directed the NBI to beef up its narcotic bureau.

The President also instructed Colt Jolly Bugario, NBI chief, to adopt a more effective program in the drive against illegal traffic in narcotics.

Narcotics addition, among others, is a determinant factor in the increase of crime in the country, the President said in his directive.

Returning Philaeg Troops To be Utilized In Civic Action Work

Returning Philippine Civic Action troops from South Vietnam will be utilized for civic action purposes, ordered General Segundo Velasco, AFP chief of staff. Operations in Central Luzon will receive an added boost with the utilization of these officers and soldiers, as well as the 1st Philippine Civic Action Group who will be completing one year tour of duty in Vietnam.

Most of the non-combatants troops are doctors, nurse, and civic action technicians, and the experience gained by these Philippine Contingents and Philippine

Civic Action Group who served in Vietnam can be put to effective use.

Philaeg personnel rendered medical, engineering and other civic action services, risking their lives in their mission to help the Vietnamese peasants.

In 26 weeks, some 600 hectares of jungle have been cleared and a network of roads and security outposts constructed.

In the medical dental field of activities alone, the Philippine civic action workers have treated for free over 240,622 Vietnamese patients as of July 24 this year.

Report Of The Present Status Of The P.N.R. Its Defects, Reason For Such Its Role In Our Economy And Program Of Improvement Now Being Undertaken. As Per Interview Conducted By The Writer At The P.N.R. Control Office, Tutuban, Manila

The Philippine National Railway is very far from what it should be, but it is much better than it used to be, thanks to the improvement instituted by the new management. That is his emphatic statement made by the General Manager, Col. Nick Jimenez when interviewed at the P.N.R. Control Office at Tutuban Station, Manila recently. The Control Office is a new addition to the existing offices of the P.N.R. aimed at maximizing the utilization of otherwise idle box cars and other equipment throughout the entire railway line.

Under the present setup,

the Manager went further, the P.N.R. can not really give the service and efficiency that the public expects due to so many factors. Among them he said, is the lack of government support and the public's lack of cooperation in the care of equipment especially in the passenger coaches. While other means of transportation like the Airlines for instance, the government maintains airports, the shipping, buses, got the wharf and piers the Bus Companies, the government maintains roads and bridges. Whereas the National Railway Line, it is

own rail line, bridges, security system, stations and so many other essentials in the operation of the railroad.

Asked why the P.N.R. is almost always in the red, Col. Jimenez said that the above-mentioned reasons plus many others and the over two million peso-monthly payroll for over 7,000 employees almost equate to what the P.N.R. is today.

As to the cry of inefficiency of the rail line, the Manager asked for more understanding from the public on behalf of the over 7,000 employees and their families. Good will, with the present trend of improvement now being instituted, efficiency will come, despite the shortage of motor cars, freight cars and passenger coaches. Passengers which are much less than before the war, the P.N.R. is doing all it can, short of miracle. Taking into consideration the increase of weight of traffic and the less equipment and its same rolls that it had been using for the last sixty five years, the P.N.R. should be given kudos and encouragement.

As to the question, "Why were 1,844 today we only have 1,097. Passenger cars in service are only 53 and 27 are alternately under repair."

Again on the public understanding and cooperation, the General Manager asked the traveling public to be more conscious too of their duty to safeguard the interest of the properties of the P.N.R. especially its equipment and the passenger coaches which are always subjected to vandalism and vandalism. Every now and then newly installed equipment and furnishings disappear.

The manager said further that it is very easy for the rail line to make money if profit is the main consideration in the operation, but the public must know that the P.N.R. has a duty to perform and that is the National Economy. The rail line has to serve the people that helps develop the country by means of transportation to the people from small and out of places stations and towns. Without the railway line, the economic development of out of way place would be rustic and stagnant.

Asked further to elaborate on this point the Manager said that to stop a train alone in a small station means hundreds of people less in terms of wear and tear of spare parts; yet small stations have to be maintained and serviced and employees have to be paid in respect of the insignificant financial returns that the Company realizes from these points. The Company has to loss if it expects to help develop out of the public and its over 7,000 employees, said Col. Jimenez.

Comparing our own railway to that of the British railway, the Manager stated that the British has a loss of 34 million pounds a year in order to support its own railway. Comparing that loss to our railway, ours is just a drop in the bucket, yet we are operating on obsolete antiquated and rails, which other foreign railway lines should have long ago discarded.

The P.N.R. is one of the worst in the world because of the lack of government financial support yet accordingly we are one of the

As to the Cagayan and the Borongan lines, Manager Jimenez said that although the project is a losing proposition it has to go ahead because it is the duty of the government to help the people in the two regions develop their economy as well as their well-being. Even though it is a losing proposition because of the cost, the Manager said, the capital to be invested in the projects can not be taken back. The Cagayan project will soon get on the way again because the situation is coming. But the Borongan line has to wait pending the final study by the Japanese financiers. It will take about six months to survey and it is estimated that it will also take five years to complete the project which will cost 160 million pesos. Already 60% of the rights of way have been secured according to the Manager.

As to the clamor of some sectors to sell the railway company to private enterprises the Manager said that to private enterprise could consider buying the Company if it has to consider giving back to the stockholders their money that they invested at the same time giving the same service to the public that the P.N.R. now is giving.

So, the Manager said that it is almost criminal to sell if we expect to have the same, or better, service and the service that the P.N.R. is now giving to the public. Maybe it is better for a private sector to put up another line of their own if they can help develop our economy.

For the present the bulk of freight carried by the railway line to points of destination comes in the following order as per volume: Flour, Lumber, Cement, Sugar, Agricultural goods and Manufactured goods. Passengers who bought tickets at station order exceed the 11 million mark as of 1996 records are operating. While the P.N.R. realized revenue from these commodities the help it makes in the movement of those goods amount to generating economic opportunities and generate job opportunities as well.

Questions and Answers on the New Voter Registration

Ques: Since Sept. 15 has passed, can voters still register under the new list? Neutor Magdaang, Lucena, Albay.

Ans.: Yes. With the signing by President Marcos of the Rodrigo-Diokno Poll Registration Bill, the registration of voters under the new list is now extended until October 15, 1997. The author has not yet gotten hold of a copy of the full text of the law. Once he does he will assure the publication in this paper of the pertinent provisions of the law. The author urges and appeals to all qualified voters to now RUSH UP TO REGISTER AT THEIR FIRST OPPORTUNITY AND WITHOUT DELAY in their respective city and municipal election registrars' offices on any day, Monday through Friday, before the offices are now open during office hours daily, Monday to Sunday. Those whose applications are still lacking, especially those who not successfully developed their IDs, to complete and have their applications validated or approved by their Election Registration Boards; those who have already received their IDs and who had photographs, but are not very sure if they could vote, to check in the list of validated and approved applications in their respective registration offices if they are included among those voters sure to vote; those who have complaints with respect to mistakes or discrepancies in their application forms, IDs, precinct number, address, etc., to complete and have them corrected immediately while the precinct books of voters are not yet sealed; and all those who are already certain to vote, to use and exert all their influence to have all the other people qualified but are not yet registered under the new list, to register NOW. AT ONCE. IMMEDIATELY AND AT THEIR FIRST OPPORTUNITY—to assure almost all qualified voters of their previous right of suffrage come November 14, 1997.

Ques: Is it true that if you do not register now under the new list, you might not be able to vote in the 1909 election? Eplidio Rur, Garambo, Camarines Sur.

Ans.: The law provides: "Any person who fails to register within sixty days after having acquired the qualifications of a voter or is registered after said period shall not be qualified to vote in the election immediately following his registration. For purposes of the nineteen hundred sixty-seven elections, however, any person who is a qualified voter may register any time before the sixty-day period preceding the date of said election." (2nd sentence of paragraph 2, Section 8, R.A. 3588, as amended).

With the approval of the Rodrigo-Diokno Poll Registration Bill, the sixty-day period preceding the date of said election is deemed amended as before the thirty-day period.

FM Informed On Filipinized Dole Philippines

The Filipinization of Dole Philippines, a subsidiary of the world's largest pineapple canning company, was effected with the taking over of most of the administrative and financial function of the company by Filipinos. President Marcos was informed recently.

The President was apprised of this revolutionary management move by Howard Hubbard, president of Dole Philippines, who said that eventually there will be total Filipino management of the company "starting from the top."

Hubbard called recently on the President to submit a progress report on Dole's operations in Mindanao.

Hubbard also informed the President that in consonance with the offer made by Castle and Cooke, Inc., another company of Dole, investments in the corporation has already exceeded \$35 million and an additional \$7 million is projected within the next two years under the Filipino management.

Dole Philippines has set up a pineapple cannery in Polomolok, Cotabato about 30 kilometers from the southern airport of General Santos. Under the new expansion scheme of the company, it will develop Filipino-owned lands into pineapple plantations rather than lease large tracts from the government as in the past.

The president of the company is slated to be turned over to Germino Z. Velasco, vice president, to replace Hubbard who is returning to the United States soon.

According to Hubbard's report which covers a five-year projection, pineapple will be the largest export of the Philippines after two years. It is now ranked No. 10 among the nation's exports.

Dole Philippines is expected to produce 200,000 metric tons of pineapple annually after two years.

At this production rate, the Philippines could expect to earn some \$57 million in foreign exchange from 1967 to 1972.

Taxes to be realized, mostly from the 30 per cent withholding tax applicable to the foreign exchange borrowings of the project is expected to amount to \$26 million.

John D. Rockefeller, for his "sincere and abiding interest in advancing the welfare of Asians, particularly the Filipino people," was conferred by President Marcos the Order of Sikatuna, with rank of Datu.

The Presidential award, as given to Rockefeller during a formal dinner hosted by the First Couple in honor of the recipients of the RM Memorial awards for 1997 in Malacanan Palace.

Rockefeller is in Manila in representation of the Rockefeller family, sponsor of the award.

loans are available to owners of privately-owned idle agricultural lands suitable for coconut but handicapped by lack of capital for the development of such lands. The loanable amount is ₱1,500.00 per hectare secured by a first mortgage on the project site and release of loan funds shall be in partial amounts spread over a 6-year period. Repayment shall be within a period of 15 years starting on the 6th year for instant acquiring from the first to the tenth year while payment on the principal together with the interest thereof shall commence on the 11th year up to the 15th year. The second plan is for owner of private wood d filled or unutilized lands presently planted to coconut who are in need of financial assistance to maintain and develop their coconut plantation. The amount of loan grantable shall depend on the actual needs of the project, paying a percentage of the borrow and loanable value of the collateral which shall consist of a first mortgage on titled or unutilized real estate and in a rable improvements such as roads and water supply mortgaged on machinery.

Loans secured by real estate or brand new machinery shall be payable in 10 years while loans secured by woodland or light machinery shall be payable in 5 years.

Both plans charge 9% interest per annum for loans up to ₱100,000 and 10% interest per annum for loans exceeding ₱100,000.
