

Weekend Notes

Ninoy Aquino, I grant, spoke in all sincerity at the Bicol Rural congress but one cannot be blamed if one thinks that his suggestion that President Marcos be reelected by a political consensus of the leaders does not sound so at all. In this country of ours, the way we take our politics, any suggestion like that coming from the Opposition is either uttered with tongue in cheek or is madness pure and simple-political madness, that is, the worst madness ever.

Senator Aquino was exhaustive in his explanations, yes, and he used all the gum of his persuasive eloquence and logic, but he himself was aware that he was suggesting an impossibility in the political milieu of the Philippines. First, he said the it was just an idea of his. His party has not as yet heard of his brainchild. Then, he added that it was a notion so venture some, so drastic, so out-of-this-world, he felt the impression it would be a bitterly contested notion.

The idea in itself was that unusual and a hard nut to crack; the implementation was yet a harder one to achieve. It would seem that only the Presidency would be the object of a consensus; as to the rest of the political realities, the same merry-go-round. And what is the good realized? A saving of some 600 million pesos, the cost of a presidential election.

The question naturally arises: What of the democratic substance which will be reduced to the decision of a handful of political pundits of both major parties? In other words, it is a veritable sellout of a fundamental democratic principle. A price-tag has been placed on it; for 600 million we will become robots of a handful of politicians. This is a deprivation of suffrage but the Senator did not spell it that way. To him it was a saving of 600 million which, in his plan, would better be spent in the economic advancement of the country.

The Senator has forgotten that the solution of an expensive presidential election is to force it to be less expensive. This is the manly solution and not the scrapping of our young democracy. We are not going to solve our political ills by running away from them. We should solve them by facing up to them and purge them as drastically as possible.

That purging should consist in cleansing it of its abuses, chiefly the abuse of money by the corrupt politicians. There are beginnings along this line but we should do more. The Congress should enact laws with teeth in them making it criminal to buy votes, to spend scandalously in his electoral campaigns, to

buy one's way into a fraudulent elective by bribing electoral employees and officials. And the President should sign them into laws real presto.

What prompted Senator Aquino to make this suggestion? Gratitude because it was a Nacionalista vote that cleared the way for him to the Senate? One cannot help suspecting that Senator Garzon, the deciding vote, was instructed by the President to cast such a vote. Ninoy Aquino was less deadly in the Senate than let loose ranging all over the country as a martyr, a victim of Presidential persecution. Shades of "Iguinuhil..." Is Ninoy's Presidential political consensus the price? Not too far-fetched if one considers the beneficiary as sure reelectionist. A very grateful man this Aquino, one should say. The trouble with all this is that it makes a picture not of Ninoy at all. And this I say because he is not known as a man of sudden changes, even if the motivation is one of gratitude for a good turn done.

One other fallacy of the Senator regarding reelectionist President being perforce a good one due to his inability to succeed himself once again according to our Constitution, is the unpredictability of the human nature. And, also, because of the cogency of his becoming just everything other than a good one, on the assumption it will be his last chance, anyway. If we must consider that he would not think of any other consideration except the good of his people, there being no reelection to prepare for what would prevent us to view him as a man in his last fling in the enjoyment of Presidential powers and privileges? A man on the eve of his marriage usually has his Saturnalia, meaning that last chance to enjoy the fruits of bachelorhood. Similarly, a President would be likely to indulge. The better reason in this case because the Presidency is by far an opportunity for greater benefits.

It is the height of disingenuousness to predicate one's speculations on the better aspect of human nature, for very few can resist the lure of power at its best. By this principle, it is dangerous to predicate a better human behavior on the certainty it is the last enjoyment of a given set of "goodies." Four years of the Presidency, with a previous enjoyment of its appurtenant realities, is a temptation hard to resist in the average human. One must bear in mind that it requires superhuman virtues of which very few - if at all - do have. And, even if we have that rare case in Pres. Marcos, what will prevent his underlings from using his name to promote their own selfish interests?

Pinaglalaoman na an P44,000.00 na halagang proyeto matatapos sa laog nin limang semana.

Incentivo Para sa Capitalistas

An gobierno provincial naghingawang maagda an mga negociantes asin darakul na capitalistas. Kun an mga recursos naturales patin yaman nin kabukidan matanyog saka gariton, ini huli kan stracion na itinatao ni Gob. Cledera. Sa sarong marhay na kaisipan (na nakaagyt nin pagtuyaw kan mga tawong mga bakong marhay na motivo) nag-agkay nia an junta provincial na magpasar nin resolusion na magbukas nin sugar central o azucarera an Southern Luzon Sugar Central, Inc., digdi sa satuya.

Sosog sa mga oficiales kan companiang naonabihan, an proyeto magkakaipo nin 40,000 hectareas na daing pakinabang na daga asin maempleo nin umabot-kumulang 10,000 katawo na matao nin kulang-kulang P12.5 M taon-taon en forma de ingreso sa kaban kan gobiernos locales.

The conference also proved

they are doing it right now with Marcos. The best of the Presidential crop we ever had - - the late Pres. R. Magsaysay - - was being degraded in a slow but sure process of erosion - - degraded by these elements. This was the consensus. His untimely death saved him from facing a fate his predecessors before him, and his successors after him, had to undergo, merited or unmerited. Democracy has many acute defects but it is the best mechanism to secure a consensus of the people's will. We can improve it, not by emasculating it, but by educating the human elements. It is this that is troubling democracy and not democracy itself.

The Rizal Day was celebrated under the auspices of the Order of the Knights of Rizal, Naga City Chapter whose Commander is Judge Jose T. Surtida.

The program was as follows: 6:30 a.m. Mass at the Metropolitan Cathedral with Msgr. Nicanor C. Belleza, parish priest of Naga, officiating. 7:30 a.m. tolling of church bells, announcing the Rizal Day. 4:30 p.m. floral offering at the foot of the monument of Rizal at Plaza Rizal by the different civic and religious organizations, private and public schools, university and colleges, and other organizations in the City.

After the laying of the wreaths, a short program was held at the foot of the

Paris - The U. S. delegation voiced "deep regret" January 6 over what appeared to be categorical rejection by a North Vietnamese press spokesman of procedural proposals it had put forward in an all-out effort to get the peace talk started.

At the same time a member of the delegation said it has not received any rejection from the North Vietnamese through official channels and does not see the conference foreclosed or frozen, or the position hardened into immobility.

Referring to the six separate designs advanced by Ambassador Cyrus Vance which would meet North Vietnam's desire for a round table and still allow the two sides to be seated opposite each other, the delegation official said:

"We would like to consider that the various proposals are still there and that we can come back to them sometime."

In the afternoon of Jan. 4, Manuel Abella, former delegate to the Constitutional Convention that framed the present Philippine Constitution, and son of one of the Bicol martyrs, a doctor of laws, was the guest speaker during the celebration of the 15 Bicol Martyrs. The speeches and musical numbers were preceded by laying of the wreaths of flowers around the foot of the monument of the 15 Bicol Martyrs.

The following was the general program prepared by the government of the city:

P. M. - MASS at the San Francisco Church; 4:30 p. M. - WREATH-LAYING at the foot of the 15 Bicol Martyrs monument by government officials, relatives of the martyrs, etc.
