Edu Smells Rat in LTC Collections He Orders To Audit Agencies

Acting Land Transportation Commissioner Romeo F. Edu ordered yesterday the audit of collections by LTC agencies which have not yet been deposited with the National Treasurer in an aggregate amount of P1 million.

The LTC commissioner said that the unaudited collections which the National Treasurer through local depositories like the Philippine National Bank for an unreasonable length of time can be the subject of certain anomalies. Edu also issued a warning to collection officers, under pain of administrative and criminal penalties to submit to the head office in Quezon City the reports or abstracts of collections in support of deposits made with the National Treasurer amounting to P3 million. Old RCA Retailers May Register Again

In view of the immediate necessity for distribution of RCA rice, Director E. V. Mendoza has written to RCA Manager Osmando Mondredo that for purposes of ap-

may use the 1964 RICOB list of registered retailers. In 1964 the amendment to the RCA Law provides that only RICOB registered retailers shall distribute RCA rice but in places where there are no registered RICOB retailers, the RCA can appoint the barrio councils. New Strains Replace Susceptible Tjere Mas

Tjere mas, a rice variety grown by farmers in Camarines Sur and other places in the country is easily attacked by rice blast. The disease destroys the leaves, flowers, panicles and grains of the plant. Furthermore, it damages the crop from seedling to maturity stage. In serious cases, the infected plants either die or produce very low yields.

However, Dr. Pedro B. Espezua, specialist of U.P. College of Agriculture, and his co-workers found four resistant strains of Tjere mas to replace the susceptible variety. These are at present being grown at the College's experimental farm for seed multiplication. The four resistant strains of Tjere mas were selected from 500 blast resistant lines from the International Rice

Research Institute at Los Baños. These are lines No. 61; 71; 80 and 254. Ordinary Tjere mas matures early, gives more productive tillers, grows tall, lodges easily and succumbs readily to rice blast. The new strains possess the same qualities except that they are resistant to rice blast and yield more than the old variety.

In Calcutta and Benares hundreds sit and lie on dirty sidewalks waiting for man's kindness and charity as their last hope of survival. In New Delhi, thousands and thousands are dying from intestinal diseases due to undernourishment.

The universal clamor of the people is American help. American help is their last and only hope in outliving the present terrifying crisis. American help in food, doctors and medicines.

And the American people, the misunderstood, the most malign, traduced and sneered of all peoples even to some blind and fanatical Filipino nationalists is now sending to India hundreds of ships fully loaded with food, in millions of tons, medicines and other human necessities.

Just think of that!

And yet, here is a people, the Indian people, who, before this catastrophe firmly stood on its belief that Nehru alone guides its fortune and its destiny. The spirit of Chauvenism or nationalism was erroneously infused into the minds and hearts of the Indians by the equally erratic minds of their national leaders up to the point when they all believed that they alone can manage to survive even if the rest of the world is destroyed by its own folly and stupidity. Air Transportation and Bicol Tourism

Air transportation is playing a major role in the development of tourism in the Bicol region.

While it is true that Legaspi City in Albay province serves as the "gateway" to the various tourist spots in Bicolandia, it is accessible from Manila by land, air and sea. It is transportation, however, that provides the fastest and most reliable means of transporting passengers to Legaspi City and other points in the Bicol area that are provided with airports.

In Bicolandia, composed of the provinces of Albay, Camarines Sur, Sorsogon, Camarines Norte, Catanduanes and Masbate - Legaspi City, the provincial capital of Albay, is gifted with the best airport in the region. Aside from having the longest asphalted airway, the Civil Aeronautics Administration maintains first class "home town" that guides incoming and outgoing domestic commercial airlines safely during inclement weather. The weather here has been the primary factor in the rapidly added by commercial aviation right at the airport complex.

On the other hand, the Philippine Air Lines, the pioneer air firm that has been serving the air-conscious riding Bicolans since pre-war years, never fail to increase their frequency of flights depending on the needs of the occasion.

During this summer season, where there is a heavy traffic of passengers brought about by the influx of tourists coming to the Bicol region and students going home to their respective provinces, the Philippine Air Line always make it possible to meet the demands of the plane riding public.

The Philippine National Railways used to bear the brunt of the passengers in traveling from Manila and every point in Bicol. But tourists could not always depend on the reliability of this government transport system. Those who have taken the railroad are unanimous in their testimony that its services far from being satisfactory. Train travel, according to Cebu Congressman T.reso Luman, who came to Legaspi last year, declared that it is "horrible". In the past, there had been several derailments which caused death to passengers. Sanitation, especially in the night or "de luxe" non-air conditioned coaches is equally poor.

There is overcrowding and arrival of trains are most of the time behind schedule. Despite the move of President Marcos and his administration to upgrade the PNR services in the south, lines which is the only money making section of the government railroad, it is believed that it will take considerable time yet to have it improved that will meet the requirements of both foreign and domestic tourists.

With the development work now going on at the Queson and Camarines Norte boundary of the Manila south coast, it is anticipated that more visitors, especially those from overseas, will be coming to Bicol by buses and private cars. Visitors will have the opportunity of tak-
