## PNR Gen. Manager Jimenez gives warning to people living near RR lines.

General Manager Nicmar T. Jimenez of the Philippine National Railways today warned people living within the vicinity of the PNR main tracks to exercise carelessness and alertness as the company increases the frequencies of train trips due to the recent arrival of new rolling stocks.

In his warning, Jimenez singled out those living in the barrios at the southern tip of Quezon and Camarines Sur provinces to stop using improvised rail skates, rickshaws and other contraptions on the PNR main lines.

Jimenez' action came in the wake of reports that accidents occurred in the lines recently due to barron folk's recklessness in riding on these "rolling coffins". He highlighted the fact that people living along the PNR main lines could and must cause approximate the arrivals of train which prompts them to use the rails with impunity.

Every time there is an increase of train trips or a mere change of schedule of runs, accidents are most likely to happen, Jimenez observed.

The PNR head issued a stern directive to all track personnel to secure the railroad tracks of any improvised transport crafts. He also ordered the PNR police officers to apprehend rail state or errors and to confiscate rickshaws, rickshaws and other crafts that are used on the railroad tracks.

### Pressman Wins Top MC Commerce Post

Medina, a third year commerce student of Masbate Colleges hereat who is also one of the directors of the Masbate Press and Radio Club was duly elected President of the College of Business Administration in an honest, clean, and orderly election held recently in the main building of the college at Rosario Street. He won over Genaro M. Kipte, another news man and member of the MPRC, by just a few votes. Elected together with Medina are the following: Genaro M. Kipte, Vice-President; Precy Floresta, Secretary; Maria Corazon Lopez, Treasurer; Andres Floresta, Auditor; Guil lermo Hermosa, Business Manager; and Renato Chu, Public & Press Relations Officer.

5. Propose membership of some qualified MC commerce students to become bona fide members of the Masbate Junior Chamber of Commerce (JAYCEES).

### Johnson Reports U.S. Tariff Cuts Pending

Washington - President Johnson will issue soon a proclamation to make the initial phase of U.S. tariff reductions stemming from the Kennedy Round negotiations effective on January 1, 1968. The cuts are to take in five equal stages.

Mr. Johnson disclosed his intention in a statement that accompanied his report to Congress on the "Kennedy Round."

The "Kennedy Round" negotiations, carried out at Geneva, involved tariff concessions on about 40,000 million dollars' worth of world trade. Key elements were cuts of about 50 per cent on a broad range of industrial goods and cuts ranging from 30 per cent to 50 per cent on others; agricultural concessions; a world grains arrangement; and non-tariff liberalization, including an anti-dumping measure, and assistance to developing countries.

### Preponderance of Fragmentation

(First of a Series)

Where the Rainbows Bend - In the wake of this week's news - it is reported that the good congressman of the second district of Camarines Sur, Fuentebella has hatched up the idea of 'dividing' the premier province and is therefore readying a bill for the opening of next January's Congress with the intents and purposes of going thru the 'partitioning' as intended into three (3) fragmentary parts, namely: 1) the province of Camarines Sur retaining the two congressional districts, 2) the province of East Camarines with one congressional seat and 3) the province of West Camarines with another lone congressional district.

The raison d'être for this concept is that the last elections failed to get the people's nod for approval of the plebiscite purporting to increase the number of congressmen to thirty or heavily populated areas - Camarines Sur included - which up to this minute is surpassing the millionth mark. Correspondingly, Camarines Sur should have five congressional districts to the ratio of one congressman for every 200,000 inhabitants.

If this idea is pushed thru and carried to the letter - the awesome spectacle is yet to happen: this premier province of Bicolandia will lose its grandeur and glamour as the title of 'premier province of Bicolandia' will pass on the province of Albay - that province where the sumptuous beauty of world renowned perfect-ened Mayon Volcano and all other beauty spots that make the province of Albay the more famous throughout the tourist world... all these added to the Albayans penchant of doing and eccentricity for progress... certainly the Albayanos will be highly honored for this sudden verge of a precious title "premier province of Bicolandia!"

The Prof. Fr. In of Power-Politics - Outside looking in - it is quite discernible from a distant vantage point the presidential choice just gone over - the offshoot of sentimentalism from the political viewpoint is being seen as having a hand in this bold adventure fragmenting the province of Camarines Sur.

Is it any wonder that the governor-elect Manding Cledera belonging as he is to the ruling Nationalista Party has ever been consulted because as things should stand - matter of this fundamental importance concerning the fate of the province of Camarines Sur should not be okay and/or endorsement of the incoming provincial administration?

Is it any wonder too that the recommitments of the last elections tainted as it was with our misgivings against the backdrop of parity disunity and due to the unexpected outcome of the presidential decision prevailing upon the congressman of the second district to campaign instead for Manding Cledera as the official candidate of the majority party.

It must be recalled that it took almost two precious months of continued party wranglings from convention time in August as well as should really be the NP standard bearer: Congressman Fuentebella or Manding Cledera. The congressman as a good soldier carried the presidential decision as the campaign manager of the election - but between the good congressman and his cronies the swells and courtiers are so heavy enough to justify the mad scramble for power.

Is it any wonder further that this preponderance of fragmentation - this partitioning of the province of Camarines Sur into three different fragmentary provinces as conceived - the end result of anti-Cledera segments within the ruling Nationalista Party in this premier province? (To be continued)

### Senator Padilla Sounds A Warning

LP Executive Vice-President Senator Ambrosio Padilla was the guest speaker of the regular weekly meeting (December 8) of the Manila Bay Breakfast Club.

Senator Padilla started his extemporaneous speech by a grim warning that there is a new lucrative profession, which does not need high school instruction nor college education; much less government board examination, and that is the utilization of "armed goons". He recounted particular incidents covered by telegrams, letters and affidavits of many LP leaders, specially in the provinces of Ilocos Sur and Cateanduanes, wherein candidates of the Nationalista Party in power have actively used "goons and guns" with the support of PC officers to subvert and frustrate the popular will. He expressed the hope, however, that the Armed Forces, particularly the PC, will

live up to the high traditions of the military in its democratic set-up of Government.

Senator Padilla said that the opposition should cooperate with the administration in the solution of many complex and perplexing problems of the country, among them high prices, production, employment, education, etc. He added, however, that another more fundamental problem has been added, namely, the maintenance of peace and order "free, honest and orderly elections" as provided in the Constitution.

Senator Padilla continued by reminding the Friday breakfasters that this problem which strikes at the very root of orderly society, that threatens the safety of person and security of home, that undermines the fundamental principle of democracy, which is the

### My Wishes To All Christians

This column wishes a Merry X'mas to all Nationalists and Liberals alike. It wishes the same thing to all Christians (Catholics, Presbyterians, Methodists, Protestants and other sectarian organizations that believe in Christ).

Volumes of essays have written by authorities an religion purporting the story of Christ as the most beautiful that ever happened since the beginning of time and will remain to be so until the end of the world. It is indubitably so because it is the story of God Himself. It is so beautiful because it was a life that was free from sins. Free from hatred. Free from envy. Free from deceit. Free from hypocrisy.

Some say in their sermons that Christ came to save us from sins. But what is not explained satisfactorily is the manner by which we can be saved from sins because of Him. Did He save us from sins because He meekly submitted Himself to be tortured and nailed on the Cross? But look what we are doing, from those in the upper echelons of us Catholics to our lower strata. We don't even endeavor to be partially His semblance in humility. But we are best in hypocrisy.

We carry rosary-beads in our pockets; we invite people to hear the Holy Mass in the chapel that we built; we show fervor of devotion in the eyes of our guests, when the truth of everything is that we really have in mind is to keep our political hold upon those people.

Yes, we are also best in the art of deception. We preach aloud. Pity, pity the poor. One, oping Christ, says he is His successor. Many of this kind live in palaces with servants to command. They eat the best of food. In fact, they almost have everything they need in a life of luxury. We preach that Christ was poverty symbolized. But many of us preaching don't understand how the poor suffers. We don't render their services without being paid. Those living in mansions with richly decorated interiors don't even open their gates to the poor.

We find enjoyment in deceiving others by professing our concern for the poor which is not at all mean. Now it is time to know that Christ is not at all in our world. He is only in the world of the needy and humble. Unless we Catholics do not choose to live the life of Jesus, we simply have no right to preach His doctrine. He said that any man who does not follow His examples and His teachings is His enemy. There are millions of us to fall on the category of "His enemy". These are my X'mas wishes to all my Christian friends.

### General Assembly again rejects Peking's Admission to U. N.

United Nations - The General Assembly has refused to give China's seat in the United Nations to the Peking communist regime.

As it has done repeatedly at past sessions, the assembly on November 28 rejected a move to recognize Peking as the only

lawful representative of China at the United Nations and to expel the Republic of China.

A draft resolution to that effect, sponsored by Albania and ten other countries - was defeated by a vote of 58 to 45, with 17 abstentions.

PACD Progress Report

President Marcos was informed recently that the Presidential Arm on Community Development undertook 45,764 various projects at municipal and barrio levels in all parts of the country within the span of one and one-half (1.50) years. The combined value of the projects is P24.51 million. Of these projects, 2,828 were assisted by USAID grants-in-aid, of which 1,398 have been completed and 1,430 are on-going. The biggest bulk, totalling 42,336, consists of self-help undertakings to which PACD and other government agencies supplied the technical know-how, guidance and supervision. Below are the accomplishments surpassed by 61 percent the achievement of the PACD for the period immediately preceding July, 1966. The above figures were gleaned from the PACD performance report for July 1966 up to Sept. 1967, submitted to Malacanang. Most of the projects were (continued on page 6).

## Two years is limit for extending services of retireable Public Officials

Two years is the limit by which the services of public officials who have reached the compulsory retirement age may be extended, President Marcos ruled recently.

The new policy had been recommended by Executive Secretary Rafael Salas in a memorandum to the President on the request for the extension of the services of Leon B. Hagan, municipal treasurer of Taal, Batangas. In view of the new policy the new request for the extension of the service of Hagan, whose services had been extended six times was disapproved.

In his instruction to Secretary Salas, the President said that the extensions of services of any government officials, who over 65 years of age, should be limited to only two years.

In no case, the President added, should the services of any government official be extended to keep him in the service even after he reached the age of 70.

Washington - "There can be peace in Southeast Asia if North Vietnam and Communist China are prepared to live at peace with their own neighbors."

"There cannot be peace in Southeast Asia if North Vietnam and Communist China are determined to seize their neighbors by force."

So said U.S. Secretary of State Rusk in an interview published Monday in the monthly magazine Readers' Digest.

geared towards the Administration's infrastructure program, notably on irrigation, road and school-building constructions.

The idea behind these projects was to spur the rural residents to help themselves on matters of common welfare, which the government has not provided funds for their accomplishments but which they may be accomplished with little assistance from the PACD and other agencies.

On the heels of President Marcos recent pronouncement of a widened barrio assistance program, the PACD has started laying the groundwork for a massive rural development program which will reach all towns in the country. At present, it is still beyond the financial and physical capability of the PACD to extend assistance to all towns.

Other highlights of the PACD performance report follow:

1. Provided leadership training to 1,074, 049 rural residents who enrolled in 18,833 classes.
2. Conducted some 10,000 information and other mass media activities, of which some 500,000 persons participated.
3. Gave training on civic action to 3,680 armed forces personnel, who represented all the major services of the AFP, and
4. Trained 230 successful civic service recruits for six months on community development.

## R.P., U.S. Scientists Discuss Fisheries Research, Oceanography at NSDB workshop

Manila - About 100 Philippine and American scientists discussed fisheries research and development and oceanography at a workshop held this week at the Science Pavilion of the National Science Development Board (NSDB).

This workshop is a concrete step taken to implement the agreement on oceanography as embodied in the joint communiqué issued by President Marcos and President Johnson during the state visit of the former to Washington in February, 1966. "Philippine-U.S. Workshop on Fisheries and Oceanography" is sponsored by the NSDB, the National Research Council of the Philippines and National Academy of Sciences and the National Research Council of the U.S. in cooperation with the U.S. Agency for International Development.

In the workshop, Philippine experts on fishery and oceanography will sit down with their American counterparts to consider the manpower training needs and opportunities for international cooperation in fisheries research and development between the Philippines and the United States on the regional basis.

## The Laurel-Lansley Communique

Baguio - The Philippine and U.S. teams, chaired by Undersecretary of Industry Cesar A. Virata and Deputy Assistant Secretary of State Eugene M. Brademan, respectively, have completed eleven days of exploratory discussions on future economic relations between the Philippines and the United States. The discussions resulted from the agreement of President Marcos and President Johnson that "there should be an early beginning of intergovernmental discussions on the concepts underlying a new instrument to replace the Laurel-Lansley Agreement after its scheduled expiration in 1974."

The discussions began November 20, 1967 and were conducted in Manila and in Baguio. The respective teams agreed at the beginning that the purpose of the discussions was to exchange ideas on the concepts underlying future trade relations and to determine the issues needing future attention by the respective governments in this area. The meetings were held in a friendly atmosphere, each team hearing opinions and learning facts which were mutually beneficial.

ment relations were examined during the discussions. Particular attention was devoted to identifying areas of agreement and delimiting issues to be resolved. Many of these issues will, of course, require further examination by both governments.  
Both groups recognized that, for any new instrument to become effective, action by the respective legislative bodies of the two countries would be required. In view of the necessity for further examination of the remaining issues, it was considered premature at this time to discuss the text of the new agreement, or the time at which any new agreement would become effective.

The teams have prepared a joint report which the chairman of each team will submit to his President. It is expected that the project will meet again at the earliest practicable date for the

purpose of attempting to resolve the remaining substantive issues, thereby making possible the negotiation of a new instrument to replace the Laurel-Langley Agreement.

Cattle Diseases Still Menaces Livestock

Raising of cattle whether for milk or beef will not prosper much in some areas of Sorsogon unless liverfluke disease is fully eradicated or at least minimized.  
Several veterinarians, private as well as those employed by the Bureau of animal industry, hinted that parasitism infection among cattle and carabao in the province is causing untold losses to farmers. Production of milk is impaired, not to mention the fact that those are usually discarded for human consumption, they said.

This will be the theme of this year's observance of the 71st anniversary of the death of Dr. Jose Rizal next Dec. 30.

President Marcos will lead the nation in honoring the hero when he lays a wreath at the foot of the Rizal monument at the Luneta. The ceremony will mark the lowering of flags to half-mast all over the nation.

Meeting in Malacanang recently, the special committee in charge of Rizal day headed by Secretary of Education Carlos P. Romulo, decided to do away with speeches and focus instead on the historical aspects of the hero's death.

The committee announced that all over the nation, the ceremonies will be characterized by "solemnity," dignity and restraint.

Main features of the commemoration include:  
1. Lecture which will be given in Calamba, birthplace of Rizal; Dapitan, his place of exile; and at Fort Santiago, where he was incarcerated and where he wrote his famous poem "My Last Farewell."  
2. Floral offerings at places abroad where the hero visited, such as at San Francisco's Palace Hotel, in Tokyo, and in Heidelberg. Led by Philippine ambassadors or consuls there, the Filipino community in each place will participate.

3. Appropriate ceremonies at the Paco cemetery where the hero was laid to rest immediately after his execution at the Luneta.

4. School children will be urged to make a pilgrimage or offer wreaths at the shrines and monuments of the hero.

5. The Philippine flag will be flown at half-mast all over the country.

Lectures at Fort Santiago will be the auspices of the Philippines Historical Commission and the Knights of Rizal. The project is headed by Fr. de la Costa, rector of Ateneo de Manila University.

Romulo said that special invitations to these lectures will be issued to presidents of students organizations, professors of history, tourist guides, labor leaders

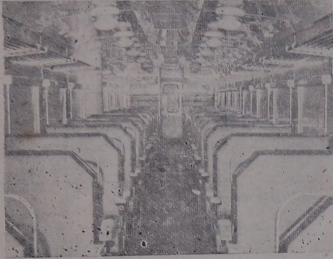

Liverfluke is endemic in several areas of the provinces. A survey two years ago in Irosin, one of the endemic areas, showed that of the carabaos tested in one barrio, 27 were found to have liverfluke infection.

BAI sent here a team to survey the extent of liverfluke infestation as well as to treat infected animals. However, lack of funds prevented the team from making such headway, considering that the parasitic disease "is not easy to control and treatment alone of infected animals is not enough, since in endemic areas where the snail hosts abound, infection is constant and continuous."

According to BAI, liverfluke has spread out into many pockets of endemicity on account of the irrigation system which serves as arteries for the dissemination of the snail intermediate hosts.

A proposal to establish a research and training center on liverfluke in Sorsogon under the auspices of the Food and Agriculture Organization has not yet materialized.

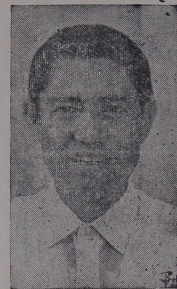
