Senator Padilla Sounds A Warning

LP Executive Vice-President Senator Ambrosio Padilla was the guest speaker of the regular weekly meeting (December 8) of the Mania Bay Breakfrst Club.

It was learned that out of the P100,000 released to the Civil Aeronautics Administration last June for the repair and improvement of the local airstrip there is still a balance of P26,000. Improvement of the Sorsogon airport was suspended last September.

Ortiz said making airport operational to commercial flights would help boost the economy of the province, besides promoting tourism development in

Philippine Air Lines suspended plans flights to Sorsogon last February. The flight suspension raised a howl of protests from various segments of the population, notably businessmen and air commuters. However, it was only late last June when funds were released.

Two years is limit for extending services of retirable Public Officials

Two years is the limit by which the services of public officials who have reached the compulsory retire-ment age may be extended, Pre-sident Marcos ruled recently.

The new policy had been recommended by Executive Secretary Rafael Salas in a memorandum to the President on the crustes of Leon B. Illigan, municipal treasurer of Taal, Batangas. In view of the new policy the new request for the extension of the service of Iligan, whose services had been extended six times was disapproved.

In his instruction to Secretary Salas, the President said that the extensions of services of any government officials, who is over 65 years of age, should be limit-ed to only two years.

In no case, the President added, should the services of any government official be extended to keep him in the service even after he reached the age of 70.



Liverfluke is endemic in several areas of the province. A survey two years ago in Irosin, one of the endemic areas, showed that of the carabaos tested in one barrio, 27 were found to have liverfluke infection.

BAI sent here a team to survey the extent of liverfluke infestation as well as to treat infected animals. However, lack of funds prevented the team from making such headway, considering that the parasitic disease "is not easy to control and treatment alone of infected animals is not enough, since in endemic areas where the small hosts abound, infection is constant and continuous."

According to BAI, liverfluke has spread out into many pockets of endemnicity on account of the irrigation system which serves a arteries for the dissemination of the snail intermediate hosts.

A proposal to establish a research and training center on liverfluke in Sorsogon under the auspices of the Food and Agriculture Organization has not yet materialized.
