
A shipment of coconut oil to Bulgaria, the 1st Philippine ex-port to a communist country, will usher in a new era of Philippine trade in the wealthy markets of Eastern Europe.

The sale of 500 long tons of coconut oil by Legaspi Oil Company to Granexport, a trading firm based in Spfia, Rulgaria, was scheduled last February, 1969. The terms of the sale are in accord with the trading rules and regulations which govern export sales to other European cities like London, Amsterdam, and Rotterdam.


