All roads lead to Naga City come September of every year. It is the festival time of Our Lady of Peñafrancia, the miraculous Virgin and patron Saint of Bicolandia.

Bicolanos throughout the country always find time once a year to go to Naga City to pay homage to their Blessed Virgin. They come by land, water and air—through the railroad, by cars and boats and by plane. There are also thousands of visitors from foreign lands and natives from various sections of the country who join the pilgrimage of the Bicolanos.

Due to the presence of varied tourist attractions in the Bicol region, most of these visitors never fail to take a look at the different natural, cultural and historical spots in Bicol.

The Board of Travel and Tourist Industry, Bicol regional office at Legaspi City, in its desire to help promote tourism, is extending its full cooperation with the city officials of Naga, provincial officials of Camarines Sur, the Bicol Weekly newspapers and metropolitan publications in disseminating information to tourists where they can go during their short sojourn at Naga City on the occasion of their pilgrimages to our Virgin of Peñafrancia.

In Camarines Sur, for example, the travellers will find delight in seeing for themselves the historical "Quince Martires" monument in Naga City's poblacion. This is a memorial to the 15 Bicolano freedom fighters who gave up their lives for the cause of our country.

Also in Naga, worth visiting are the sprawling campus of University of Nueva Caceres, the first university and best laid out school campus in the Bicol area; Colegio de Santa Isabel, the oldest and exclusive girls' institution in Bicol; the age-old cathedral of Nueva Caceres; Nordia Lodge Resort and others.

The quaint and small sleepy town of Buhil in Camarines Sur is a "must" for tourists. It boasts of its placid lake, "La Roca Encantada", a mass of big boulders piled along the beach of the lake, its numerous waterfalls, which needs further government development; Buenavista Resort, a high promontory overlooking the lake, and "tabios," the smallest edible and commercial fish in the world.

Other places to see are the "grotto" of Our Lady of Lourdes on the top hill in Iriga, the zigzag road of Sipocot leading to Daet, Bato Lake and the different islands along Sagay town, scene of some international movie locations.

At nearby Albay province, majestic Mayon Volcano beckons the visitors. The only live volcano in the world with a near-perfect cone, Mayon serves as the symbol of Philippine tourism. Here, 2,509 feet above sea level, the government Board of Travel and Tourist Industry (BTTI), recently constructed a Malayan type mountain lodge costing P100,000 where tourists can pass their days and nights.

Equally interesting are the historic "Battle of Legaspi" monument near the city's supermarket. Puro white beach, Kalaykai black beach resort at Sto. Domingo, Ta-

baco pier, Naglagbong boiling lake, Tiwi hot springs resort, Joroan's "banging roads", Rosa-Monte's Diavoland in Tabaco, modern abaca stripping at barrio Paulog in Ligo, the buried church of Cagsawa, Daraga church on top of a hill and its "stairway to heaven," abaca handicraft industries, Kimantong's winding sky-view drive and Legaspi oil factory, a multi-million Philippine-American joint business venture that processes coconut into oil for export abroad.

Sorsogon is another Bicol province that abounds with tourist attractions.

Foremost is Bulusan Lake, dubbed as the "Switzerland of the Philippines." The BTTI recently built a modern rest house here and constructed a cemented path along its Lover's Lane where visitors can now walk around the lake with considerable ease and comfort. The BTTI also donated a twinmotored fiberglass speed boat for use of tourists for a leisurely drive in the natural lake which is located high above mount Bulusan.

Rizal White Beach is another top attraction of Sorsogon. The BTTI also donated a pavilion for use of bathers and excursionists. Rep. Salvador Ebeinas also built here a multi-million-peso hotel beach resort.

Other tourist spots of Sorsogon attracting domestic and overseas travellers all-year round are Masaroc medicinal swimming pool, San Benso Springs resort, the Old Irosin catholic church that perched on the side of a hill, Sorsogon bay where the sunset rivals that of Manila in beauty, the well laid out lawn of the provincial capitol, Palhi springs swimming resort, "Tolong Gopo" beach in Bacon and others.

Camarines Norte, another Bicol province, provides numerous attractions for the visitors.

by the Filipinos in honor of Dr. Jose P. Rizal after he was shot at Bagumbayan, was built in Daet, the provincial capital.

Mercedes town has its long white beach; which is favorite among excursionists and visitors from outside the province, need a pavilion. It has also the only wooden ship and boat building yards in Bicol.

At Pnaganiban is located the government NASSCO steel shipyards. Its barrio, Larap, is the site of the Philippine Iron Mines, one of the world's biggest of its kind.

Several of the towns have gold deposits. Its mountains are rich in timber and wild games like deer, pigs and chickens.

A number of its municipalities are inhabited by negroes which are tourist attractions.

The island province of Catanduanes is equally gifted with tourist spots. Known as "an island in the sun," it has long, white beaches. Facing the Pacific Ocean, the natives and their visitors bath on its beaches shaded by swaying coconut trees or bask under the sun:

Top attraction of the province is Balingbong waterfalls. Source of hydroelectric power, it is located in Bato town, a few kilometers from Virac, provincial capital. It is provided with a swimming pool. This needs further improvement as this was destroyed by a series of typhoons that lashed Catanduanes during the past years.

There is also a historical cave between Virac and Calolbon. It needs a flight of stairs in going down from the national road. A waiting shade can be constructed for tourists.

The cattle province of Bicol is Masbate. Being another island province; towns along the seacoast are lavish with long stretch of beaches. A small island near Masbate capital is surrounded by white beach which needs a pavilion for sea bathers and excursionists.
