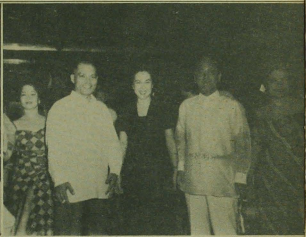
55 Years Ago

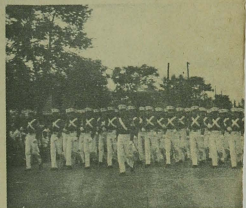
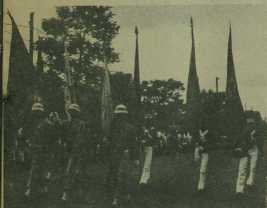
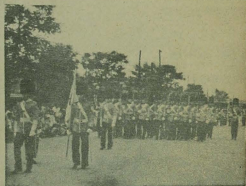
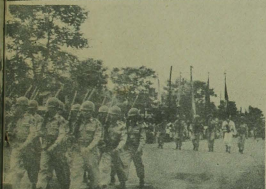
Quezon's Birthday

On August 19 the nation celebrated the birthday of the late President Manuel Quezon. Center of celebration was Quezon City. Photo shows Quezon Monument in front of the Quezon City Police Headquarters.



Quezon City parade in honor of President Quezon was participated in by representative units of the Armed Forces and by ROTC cadets, as well as by other government and private organizations.





"Cry of Balintawak"

Once again the nation observed a red-letter day, the "Cry of Balintawak", with Andres Bonifacio, father of the Katipunan, as the focal point of the people's tribute. Recalled was the "cry" of the "great plebeian" which incited a major uprising against the colonial government in the country in 1898. Revolution veterans, civilian and military officials, and the public at large converged at the Bonifacio Monument in Balintawak (shown above at left). Photos at extreme left (lower panel) show parts of the parade. Photo above shows Senator Gil Puyat addressing the large crowd of celebrants. Behind him are other officials, among them Hon. Hermenegilda Gonzaga, Felipe Jose, Mrs. Faustino Aguilar, Dr. Florentino Olivares and Dr. Herminio Velarde. A distinct participant in the celebration was Maj. Gen. Joseph Harper, chief of the JUSMAG, who is shown in photo at left speaking on the great significance of the event. He also took part in the ceremonial raising up of the "KKK" emblem.
